Flexible Parent Meetings

Pompano Beach Elementary will offer a flexible number of meetings, such as meetings in the morning or evening, and may provide with funds under this part, transportation, childcare, or home visits, as such services relate to parental involvement [Section 1116(c)(2)].

Pompano Beach Elementary will schedule meetings to be held at various times during the day and evening to accommodate parents and schedules. Our school is making its annual Open I, which is an orientation for parents and students at the beginning of the year. The Title 1 Liaison will provide parents with information about school participation in the Title 1 program and encourage parents to participate in the school's Title 1 review and school improvement plans.

Throughout the school's tears, teachers are holding one lecture with the parents of the children in their

classrooms. Parents will receive a summary of their child's test results and an explanation of the intervention the teacher will use to help the child reach their goal of fulfillment. Parents will also have the opportunity to provide other suggestions to coordinate school efforts to improve their children's performance.

The school will offer parents a special workshop each year to provide an explanation of the state's assessment system, standards and other accountability measures. In addition, the school will host specific academic training for the subjects of Reading, Mathematics, Science, and Scripture. The principal or assistant principal will issue a monthly newsletter and weekly link to parents interacting with parents to ensure all parents are informed and stay on top of school events.


