Flexible Parent Meetings

Boulevard Heights Elementary School will schedule meetings to be held at various times during the day and evenings to accommodate parent needs. The school will offer parents a special workshop each year to provide an explanation of statewide assessment systems, standards, and other accountability measures. In addition, the school will host several academic and literacy trainings to provide additional support.

Parents will also be given the opportunity to ask questions to help them better understand all the items discussed at the Annual Title 1 Public Meeting. Parents who qualify will be notified of the school choice options during Open House. FAST assessment data will be shared via the school's newsletter, website, and Annual Title 1 Public Meeting. School events will have personnel providing language support as needed.


