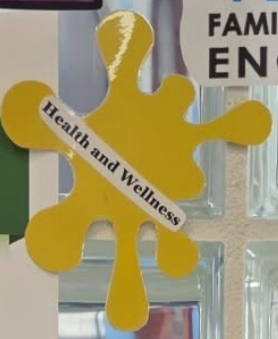

- Family Therapists

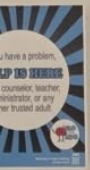


### Family Counseling Program

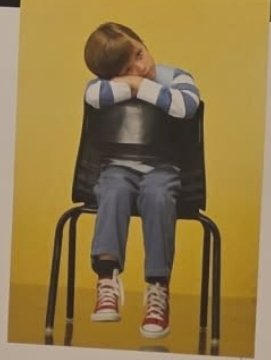
