Coconut Creek High School, located in northwest Broward County, Florida, serves a diverse student body from Margate, North Lauderdale, and Pompano Beach. The campus sits just one mile west of Florida's Turnpike and operates as part of the Broward County Public Schools district.

Over the past three years, enrollment has gradually declined from 2,029 students in 2023–2024 to 1,976 students in 2025–2026. Despite these shifts, the school maintains a strong academic program that includes a variety of rigorous academic coursework and sustains a 91% graduation rate.

The current enrollment stands at approximately 1,926 students. The student population reflects rich cultural diversity: 74.5% Black or African American, 19.5% White, 2.7% Asian, 1.7% multiracial, and smaller percentages of Pacific Islander and Indian students. The staff of 132 comprises 78 females and 52 males. Demographically, 52.2% identify as Black or African American, 34.8% as White, 10.8% as Hispanic or Latino, and 2.2% as Asian. Principal Dr. Nicole Nearor leads the administrative team alongside four assistant principals.

The broader Coconut Creek community includes approximately 57,587 residents. Demographics consist of 55.1% White, 16.3% Black or African American, 3% Asian, and 18.7% identifying with two or more races.

A unique challenge for the school is its location in a community where many residents are not directly zoned to attend. In response, school leaders have strengthened outreach and engagement efforts across Margate, Coconut Creek, and North Lauderdale. Partnerships with local government officials, including the mayors of Margate and Coconut Creek and the city commissioner, have deepened ties between the school and its surrounding neighborhoods.

Coconut Creek High School's purpose centers on its commitment to educating students for success today, tomorrow, and forever. Its mission focuses on providing a safe learning environment that maximizes each student's potential through targeted academic and career-oriented programs.

- Rigorous academic courses in math, science, English, and social studies that emphasize inquiry, critical thinking, and real-world application.
- Career and technical education (CTE) pathways, including the Creek Technical Academy (CTA), which prepares students for postsecondary opportunities and workforce readiness.
- The Cambridge International Program, which cultivates global perspectives and academic excellence.
- Targeted support services for exceptional students and English Language Learners to ensure equitable access to learning.

The school sets high expectations through the Cougar Standard of Excellence, inspiring students to believe, build, and bloom. Personalized instruction, mentorship, and community partnerships equip students to navigate academic and life challenges with confidence and resilience.

Over the past three years, Coconut Creek High has achieved meaningful gains in academics, culture, and infrastructure. The school earned its first-ever "B" rating on Florida's statewide grading system, signaling stronger student outcomes and instructional practices.

Academic performance surged in science and social studies. Biology scores rose dramatically, with 74% of students scoring at Levels 3–5 on the 2025 End-of-Course Assessment, compared to just 19% the year before. U.S. History results also improved, while Algebra and Geometry remain priority areas due to persistently high rates of Level 1 scores.

The school expanded its magnet and career programs, including the Creek Technical Academy and the Cambridge International Program, which have boosted student engagement and postsecondary readiness. These pathways challenge students academically while building practical skills for college and careers.

To support students holistically, the school launched after-school tutoring and mentoring initiatives such as the FIREWALL Program, held Tuesday through Thursday. These supports reinforce the Cougar Standard of Excellence by nurturing academic skills and personal growth.

Infrastructure improvements also signal forward momentum. With district funding through the SMART Futures initiative, the school began demolishing unsafe structures and upgrading facilities. Renovations include fire alarm enhancements, HVAC improvements, and modernization of the media center, with full completion expected by Q4 2026.
