Family Success Administration Division

FAMILY SUCCESS ADMINISTRATION DIVISION (FSAD)
MISSION: To provide assistance to individuals and families in achieving economic and social stability.

PROGRAMS:

Emergency Assistance (EA)

Provides short-term emergency payments for rent, mortgage, and utilities through our network of four (4) Family Success Centers. This assistance is not income-based. Below are the primary requirements:

- Broward County resident for at least three (3) months
- Unexpected loss or reduction of income of 10% or more through no fault of your own
- Inability to pay monthly basic expenses after unexpected loss or reduction of income
- Must have a sustainability plan to meet the household's basic expenses moving forward

Community Action Agency (CAA)

• **Low Income-Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP)** – Provides utility bill (electric) assistance for residents living at 150% or below the Federal Poverty guidelines or at 60% or below of the State Median Income. Applicants may receive assistance up to three times per year.

• **Community Services Block Grant (CSBG)** – Provides case management services to individuals at or below 200% of the federal poverty level. Services include assistance with education, vocational training, textbooks, childcare, housing, and employment.

• **Financial Capability Program (FCP)** – Offers personalized financial coaching and conducts virtual workshops focused on financial literacy to assist individuals in cultivating sound financial habits, creating a sustainable budget, enhancing credit scores, setting financial objectives, and boosting financial competence.

Additionally, a match savings program is available to assist residents in saving for the purchase of a home, vehicle, security deposit, education expenses, hurricane home improvements, or major home repairs.

• Eligibility requirements are based on household gross income, which cannot exceed 400% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines, and demonstrate the ability to save a specified amount each month.

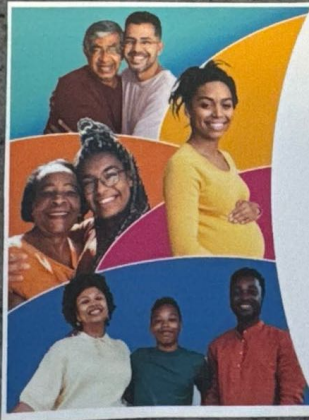

INFORMATION SHEET

At the Family Success Administration Division, we may assist with emergency financial assistance and other services if required qualifications are met and the proper documentation provided.
 Emergency Assistance from Broward County General Funds can only be provided once every twenty-four (24) months and is limited to three (3) payment episodes per lifetime.

QUALIFICATIONS:

1. A written threat of eviction or a written notice of mortgage default or threat of default in **Applicant's Name** or adult household member's name. Utility final or disconnect notice in **Applicant's Name** or adult household member's name. Some funds may not require eviction notices or default notices. Staff will further advise on this requirement.
2. Proof of an unexpected reduction or interruption of household income in the past 180 days, not caused by applicant or adult household member. Reduction or loss of income must be at least 10% of the household monthly income prior to the emergency.
3. Proof of ability to pay basic household expenses prior to the interruption or reduction of income (past income).
4. Proof of ability to continue paying bills if assistance is provided. This can be a written job offer, a benefits award letter, a letter from your employer stating the job is being held pending return to work, etc.
5. Proof of Broward County residency for at least 3 months.

Other guidelines or restrictions may apply. All payments are subject to Policy Guidelines and availability of funds.

DOCUMENTATION:

1. Unexpired picture identification for all household members over the age of 18.
2. Documentation verifying the Social Security number for all household members.
3. Eviction or default notice AND/OR final or disconnect notice for utilities.
4. Current Rental Lease agreement OR Current Mortgage Statement.
5. Proof of past and/or current total household income.
6. Proof of interruption of household income or unexpected expense in the past 180 days.
7. Proof of future household income.
8. Police report dated within 48 hours of incident, if income interruption is caused by theft.
9. Red Cross referral in case of fire.

Note: Additional documents may be requested by the staff.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION:

1. Please be aware that there are documents to review, and the screening process could take more than one phone call.
2. Please be aware that providing documents does not guarantee eligibility.
3. Broward County submits payments directly to the utility company, landlord, or mortgage holder only.

Got Involved...

Being involved in your child's education helps them do well in school and improves the quality of your school. Here are some suggestions on how to get involved. Take the time to get involved - it makes a difference!

1. Take your child to school on the first day.
2. Tell your child these four school is important. Be sure to ask questions about homework and set up a quiet place for your child to work.
3. Read everything that is read during their school. Report cards, homework assignments, school lunch menus, and calendar and bus schedules. Show your child that you are all interested.
4. Get to know your child's teachers and school principal by attending school meetings and parent-teacher conferences.
5. Ask for copies of school notices (e.g., attendance and discipline). If there is something you do not understand, ask questions.
6. Volunteer to help with school activities. Attend sports events, school and homework, or volunteer to work in the school office.
7. Visit your child's classroom when class is in session. Sit at parent-teacher conferences. Get the up to date news with the school office and the teacher.
8. Talk to other parents. If there is a parent organization, join it. If there is no parent organization at your school, look about starting one. Finding two or three other interested parents is a good start.
9. Encourage your child to read at home. Visit local libraries or used book stores, school libraries, or book fairs to pick out books together. Pick out books to read after to read.
10. Being involved in a child's education is just as important for grandparents, guardians, and other adults who care for a child.
11. Invite grandparents, guardians, and other adults who care for your child to participate in school activities.
12. Your attitude, not just your words, makes an impression that will last a lifetime.

What are the Parents-Teacher Conferences?

With knowledge of current classroom conferences during the school year. These are some questions and comments you may have and want to have when you attend your meeting. Make note of your child's comments to help you with your questions. You get to a chance to share important information as well as ask questions. Remember, you can and should talk to your child's teacher throughout the year.

- Questions to ask the students in all grades:
- Do my child performing at grade level?
 - What are my child's strengths and weaknesses in reading, math, and science?
 - How much time does my child spend on homework?
 - Are my child assignments completed accurately?
 - Does the school have special programs to meet my child's needs?
 - Does my child have special learning needs? Are these special classes my child should be in?
 - Do you have a folder of my child's work? If not, could you please I see it?
 - Does my child have other friends? How well does my child get along with the other students?
 - What can we do at home to support classroom learning?
 - What is the best way to help to teach with you?
- Additional questions for middle and high school students:
- How can I help my child to work independently and make the best use of time?
 - How can I help my child prepare for high school?
 - What can you tell me about your program and how I can help my child handle difficult situations—drug, alcohol, and sex?
 - What courses should my child take to satisfy graduation requirements?
 - Do you have a list of courses my child should take to be ready to enter college?
 - If my child plans to attend college, how will the school help with the application process?
 - If my child plans to attend college, how will the school help my child find out about financial aid?
