Dear parents and guardians,

We are excited to inform you that Broward County Public Schools (BCPS) has partnered with Hazel Health to provide **free** telehealth services to all students, regardless of their health insurance status. This initiative aims to boost student attendance by addressing minor health concerns in the clinic rather than sending students home whenever possible.

While all students can access Hazel's telehealth services from home, they are also available in many schools across the District for use during the school day.

With your consent, minor issues such as headaches, stomach aches, coughs, congestion, and other minor ailments can be treated with standard over-the-counter medications recommended by a Hazel Health provider. These medications include Tylenol, Advil, Pepto, antacids, throat lozenges, cough syrup, Sudafed, hydrocortisone cream, allergy medications such as Benadryl and Zyrtec, eye drops, and antibiotic ointment.

We believe this partnership will greatly benefit our students by ensuring they receive timely healthcare and can continue their education with minimal disruption. The Grants Administration's [Grants Dashboard](#) offers real-time information on GA-supported grants for the 23-24, 24-25 and 25-26 school years. This dashboard provides a consolidated view of all grants that are in development (in progress), have been submitted, and/or have been awarded.

From May 2025 to August 2025, the GA department helped submit over 90 grants; of which 49 have been approved for a total of over \$41,394,353 awarded.

INFORMATION SHEET

At the Family Success Administration Division, we may assist with emergency financial assistance and other services if required qualifications are met and the proper documentation provided.

Emergency Assistance from Broward County General Funds can only be provided once every twenty-four (24) months and is limited to three (3) payment episodes per lifetime.

QUALIFICATIONS:

1. A written threat of eviction or a written notice of mortgage default or threat of default **in Applicant's Name** or adult household member's name. Utility final or disconnect notice **in Applicant's Name** or adult household member's name. Some funds may not require eviction notices or default notices. Staff will further advise on this requirement.
2. Proof of an unexpected reduction or interruption of household income in the past 180 days, not caused by applicant or adult household member. Reduction or loss of income must be at least 10% of the household monthly income prior to the emergency.
3. Proof of ability to pay basic household expenses prior to the interruption or reduction of income (past income).
4. Proof of ability to continue paying bills if assistance is provided. This can be a written job offer, a benefits award letter, a letter from your employer stating the job is being held pending return to work, etc.
5. Proof of Broward County residency for at least 3 months.

Other guidelines or restrictions may apply. **All payments are subject to Policy Guidelines and availability of funds **

DOCUMENTATION:

1. Unexpired picture identification for all household members over the age of 18.
2. Documentation verifying the Social Security number for all household members.
3. Eviction or default notice AND/OR final or disconnect notice for utilities.
4. Current Rental Lease agreement OR Current Mortgage Statement.
5. Proof of past and/or current total household income.
6. Proof of interruption of household income or unexpected expense in the past 180 days.
7. Proof of future household income.
8. Police report dated within 48 hours of incident, if income interruption is caused by theft.
9. Red Cross referral in case of fire.

Note: Additional documents may be requested by the staff.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION:

1. Please be aware that there are documents to review, and the screening process could take more than one phone call.
2. Please be aware that providing documents does not guarantee eligibility.
3. Broward County submits payments directly to the utility company, landlord, or mortgage holder only.

Dear Parent/Guardian

Children need healthy meals to learn. Broward County Public Schools offer healthy, nutritious meals every school day. Breakfast is free to all students under the Universal-Free Breakfast Program; the lunch meal price is \$3.00 in Elementary, \$3.35 in Middle and \$3.50 in High School. Your children may qualify for free meals or for reduced price meals. Reduced price is \$0.40 for lunch. Paid meal prices at Charter schools are not established by The Broward County School Board.

To apply for Free or Reduced-Price Meals, complete a meal application online at www.myschoolapps.com. If you are unable to complete an application online, contact Food and Nutrition Services at 754-321-0250 to receive a paper Multi-Child Application for Meal Benefits. If you complete a paper application, please return the form to: Food and Nutrition Services, 7720 W. Oakland Park Boulevard, Suite #204, Sunrise, Florida, 33351. After your application has been processed, notification of your child's meal eligibility will be sent to the e-mail address provided or through the postal service.

Household size and income criteria will be used to determine eligibility. An application cannot be approved unless it contains complete eligibility information. Once approved, meal benefits are good for an entire school year; it is not necessary to notify Food and Nutrition Services of changes in income and household size. You may apply for meal benefits at any time during the school year. If a household member becomes unemployed or circumstances change, your child may be eligible for free or reduced-price meals. The information provided on the application will be used for the purpose of determining eligibility and may be verified at any time during the school year.

Households that receive Florida SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program), Florida TANF (Temporary Assistance for Needy Families) or FDPIR (Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations) benefits, are required to list on the application only the child's name, the name and valid Florida SNAP, Florida TANF or FDPIR case number for the person who receives the benefits, and signature of an adult household member. When a case number for any household member is listed on the application, all children in the household are eligible for free meals. Children in households participating in WIC (Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants and Children) may be eligible for free or reduced-price meals.

If you have migrant, homeless, runaway or foster children living with you and you haven't been informed your children will get free meals, please contact the District's Migrant Coordinator at 754-321-1414, Homeless/Runaway Liaison at 754-321-1566 or Foster Care Liaison at 754-321-1551 to see if they qualify. Foster children will receive free benefits regardless of the child's personal income or income of the household.

All other households must provide the following information listed on the application: names of all children and adults living in the household, and the school name for each child; total household income listed by gross amount normally received, how often the income is received by each household member and type of income (e.g., wages, child support, etc.); check the "no income" box if applicable; last four digits of the Social Security Number for the adult signing the application or check the box if this household member does not have a Social Security Number; and signature of an adult household member certifying the information provided is correct. If you normally get overtime, include it, but do not include it if you only work overtime sometimes. You or your children do not have to be U.S. citizens to qualify for free or reduced-price meals. You may list a foster child and all other household members on one application. If the foster family is not eligible for free or reduced-price meals, it does not prevent a foster child from receiving free meal benefits.

For the purpose of determining household size, deployed service members are considered a part of the household. Families should include the names of the deployed service members on their application, and report only that portion of the deployed service member's income made available to them or on their behalf to the family. If you are in the Military Housing Initiative or get combat pay, do not include these allowances as income. If you get an off-base housing allowance, it must be included as income.

Under the provisions of the Free and Reduced-Price Meal Policy, the Meal Benefits Coordinator will review applications and determine eligibility. If you are dissatisfied with the ruling of the official, you may wish to discuss the decision with the determining official on an informal basis by calling Food and Nutrition Services at 754-321-0250. If you wish to make a formal appeal, write to: Mary Mulder, Director of Food and Nutrition Services, 7720 W. Oakland Park Boulevard, Suite #204, Sunrise, Florida, 33351 or call 754-321-0215.
