All eligible students needing bus transportation for the upcoming school year **MUST** register for bus assignment. Use the webpage below to register for a bus assignment for the next year. Private Schools, Charter School, and new registering students entering the Broward County Public School (BCPS) system, that are eligible for transportation can register starting March 18, 2024.

Newly enrolled students to Broward County Public Schools, eligible for transportation, need an assigned student ID prior to registering to ride. Please contact your school to get a student ID. It could take several days for your student information to populate in the transportation database (approx. 3-4 days).

Eligible students registered by will be guaranteed a bus for the first day of school.

- 4.) Press Submit to complete. You may return to the form at any point before the deadline to update your answer.

Register by June 28, 2024, be guaranteed a bus for the first day of school. After registration, contact your assigned school for an effective bus assignment date.

After July 12, 2024, may not get a bus until the second week of school, bus assignment timelines will vary. You must register to ride. After registration, contact your assigned school for an effective bus assignment date.

PROOF OF RESIDENCE REQUIREMENTS CHART (POLICY 5070)



For the question "The student's primary housing is," what answer did the Registering Person provide?

Owned by the parent/guardian.

Rented with a valid lease agreement.

Shared with someone by choice (not due to financial hardship) with a valid Affidavit of Shared Housing.

Shared with someone due to loss of housing, economic hardship, or similar reason, temporarily living in a car or park, a hotel/motel or a homeless shelter (McKinney-Vento eligible).

Proceed with the **regular proof of address requirements**. Registering person shall submit one document from Column A and one document from Column B from the Proof of Residence Documentation Table.

Registering Person must **complete the Affidavit of Shared Housing** with notarization, and: The owner/renter of the home shall submit one document from Column A and one document from Column B from the Proof of Residence Documentation Table; and the registering person must provide two documents from Column B from the Proof of Residence Documentation Table.

Student is **experiencing homelessness** and must be **immediately enrolled**. (Policy 5020)

REGISTER THE STUDENT FOR THE HEART PROGRAM

- Registering person completes a Student Housing Questionnaire (SHQ).
- Provide completed SHQ to HEART Designee (if unavailable, scan and e-mail SHQ to HEART @browardschools.com).
- PONY the original SHQ back to:

REQUIRED DOCUMENTATION FOR ENROLLMENT

Proof of residence documents are not required. For all other required documents, a **grace period of 30 days** shall be provided.

PROOF OF RESIDENCE DOCUMENTATION TABLE (FROM POLICY 5070)

All documents must be current and include the name of the parent and contact information (street address, e-mail address). For utility bills, provide meter numbers. In commercial establishments, provide the business name. Examples of acceptable documents reflecting residential street addresses are as follows:

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Property tax bill. • Homestead exemption or homestead renewal receipt. • Deed. • Mortgage statement • Home purchase contract, including specified closing date within 30 days of enrollment and a copy of the deed to be provided within 30 days of closing date. • Properly executed, notarized lease agreement with name of tenant and landlord and contact information for all parties valid only through the expiration date indicated on the agreement. Upon expiration, parents must present a copy of the renewed or new agreement to the school office. • Current rent receipt with the name of the tenant and landlord and contact information for all parties. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Utility bill (i.e., electric, water, waste). • Home telephone or cellular phone bill. • Verification of tenancy letter from homeowner or condominium association. • Declaration of Domicile Form from the County Records Department. • State of Florida driver's license. • State of Florida identification card. • Automobile registration. • Automobile insurance policy. • Credit card statements. • Two consecutive bank account statements. • United States Postal Service confirmation of address change.

*In extenuating circumstances, money may not be required.



Student and Family Counseling Assistance

The Family Counseling Program at Broward County Public Schools provides services to help families cope with complex issues and challenges they may experience in everyday life. These challenges often affect student performance in school, and counseling can help the student function more effectively at school, at home and in the community.

Staff

The Family Counseling Centers are staffed with master's or doctoral level, licensed therapists who have extensive experience in individual and family counseling. Services are available in English, Spanish, Portuguese and Haitian Creole.

Services

The Family Counseling Program provides short-term individual and family counseling to help address challenges across a number of areas including:

- Significant family issues including communication, divorce/separation, abandonment, parenting skills, abuse, and bereavement/loss.
- Social issues including self-esteem, bullying, peer pressure, and conflict resolution.
- Emotional issues such as anxiety/depression, crisis intervention, trauma, anger management, stress management, and mild substance misuse.
- School-related issues including study skills, school anxiety/phobia, attention deficit disorder, attendance, and behavioral issues in class.

Appointments

Appointments for day and evening counseling sessions can be arranged by contacting the Family Counseling Office at 754-321-1590.
