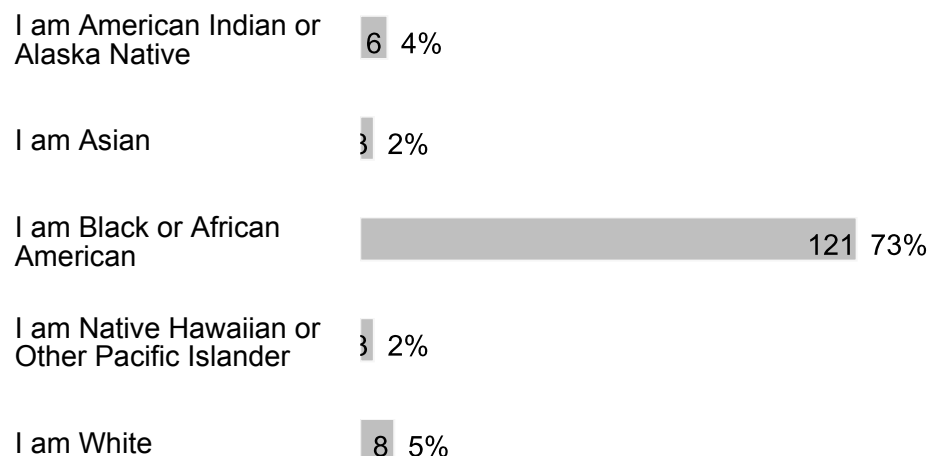

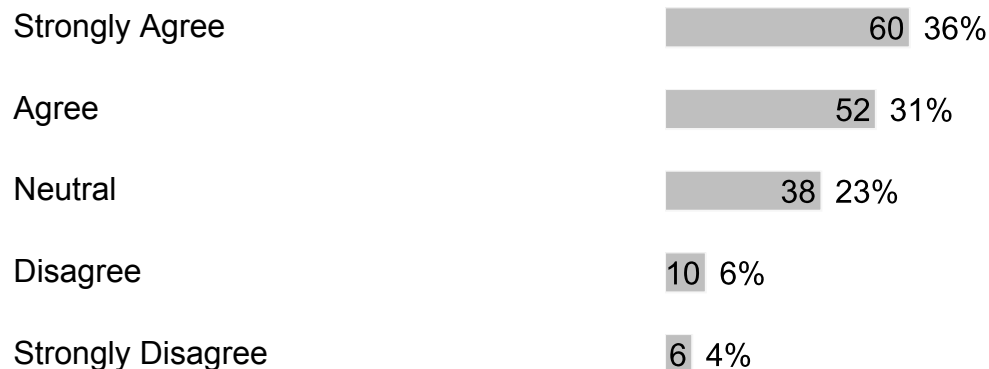

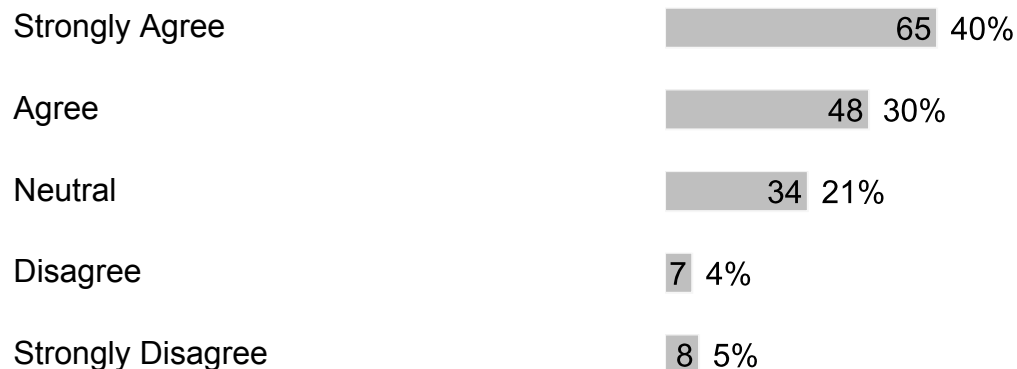

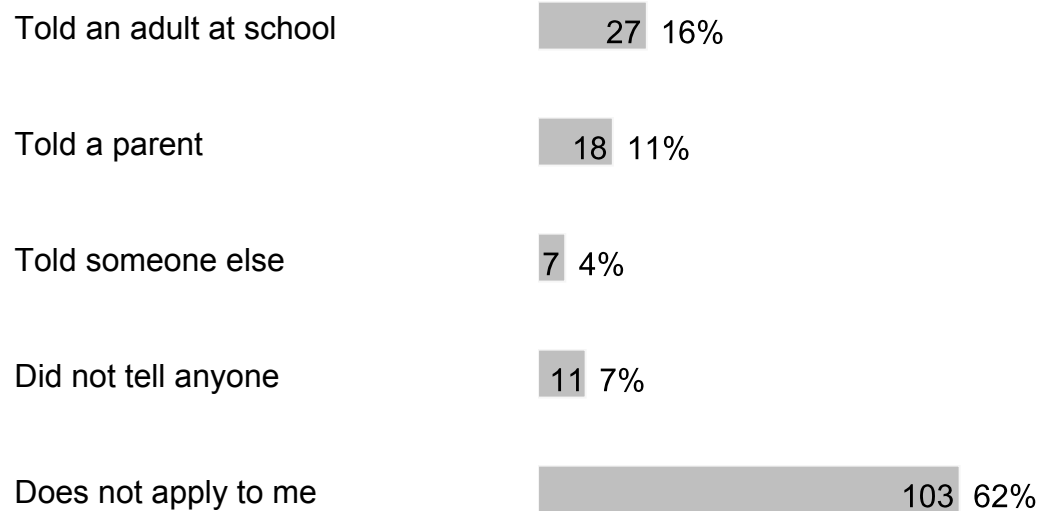

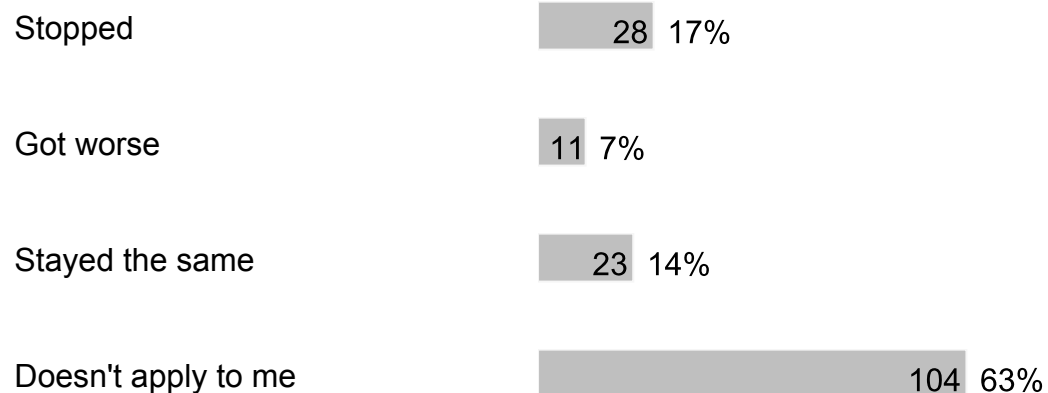

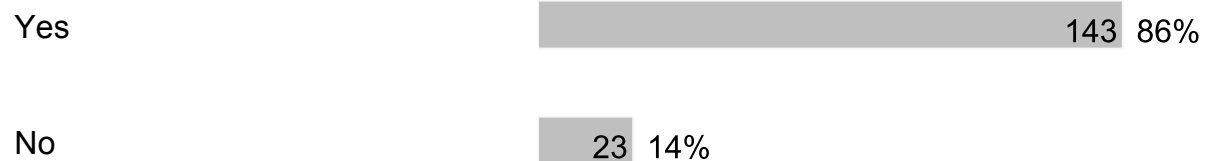

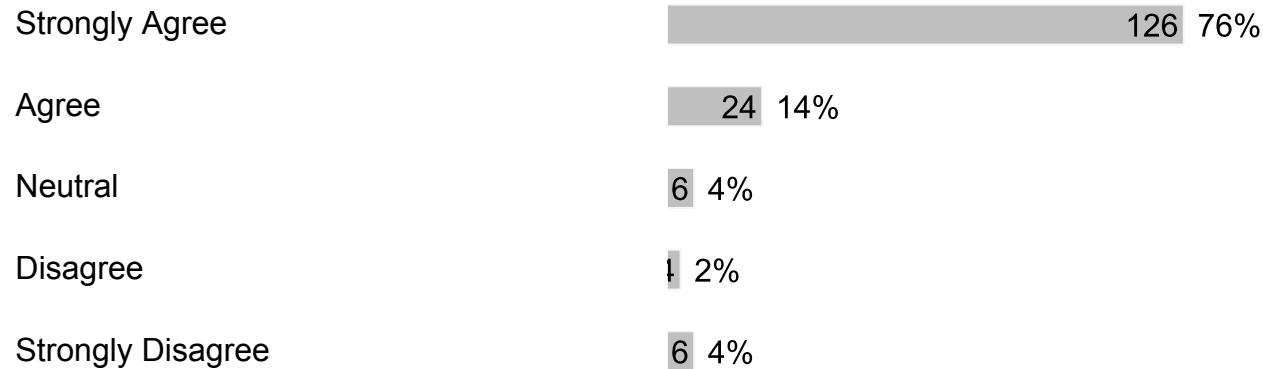

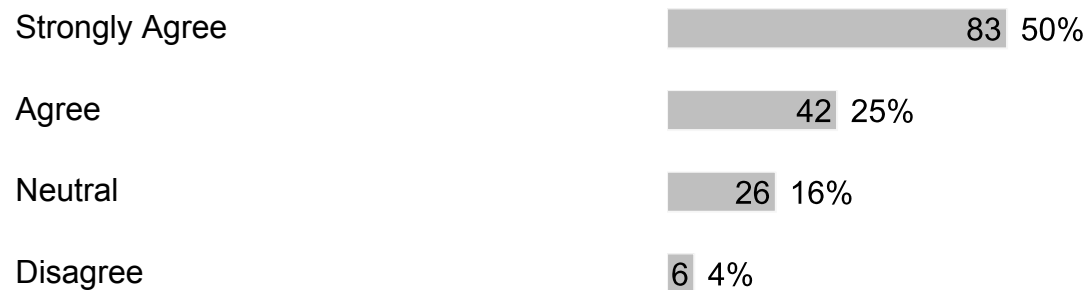

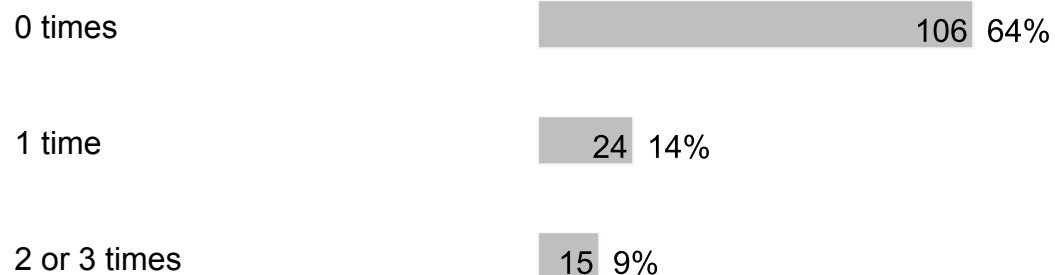

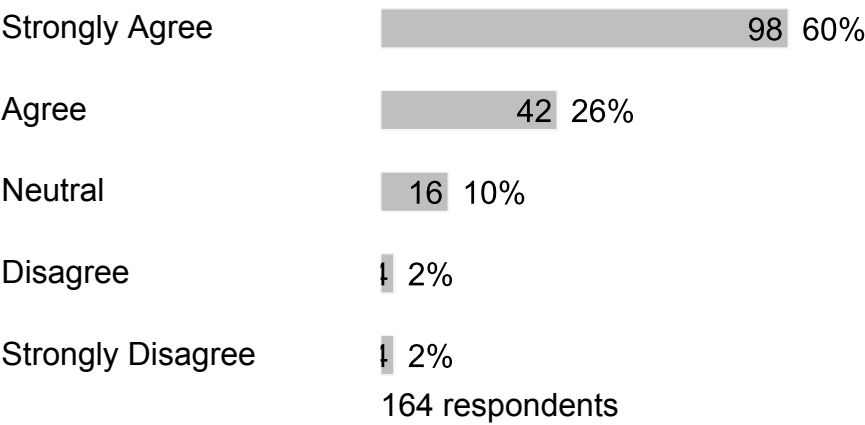

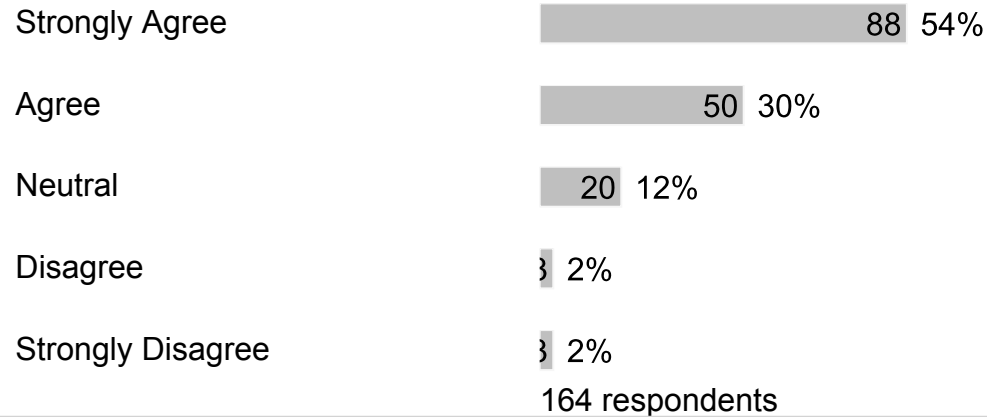

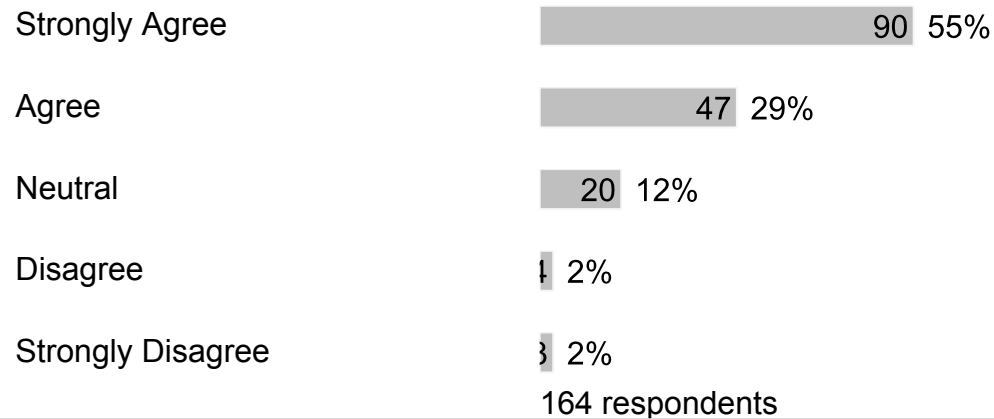

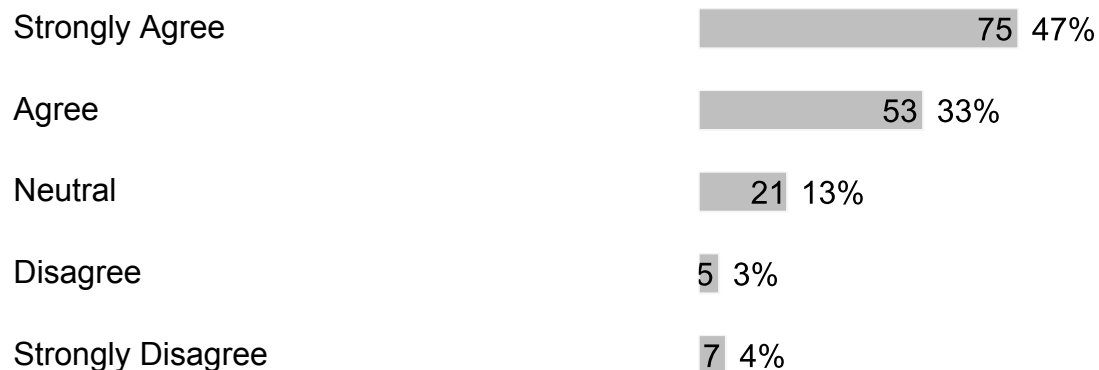

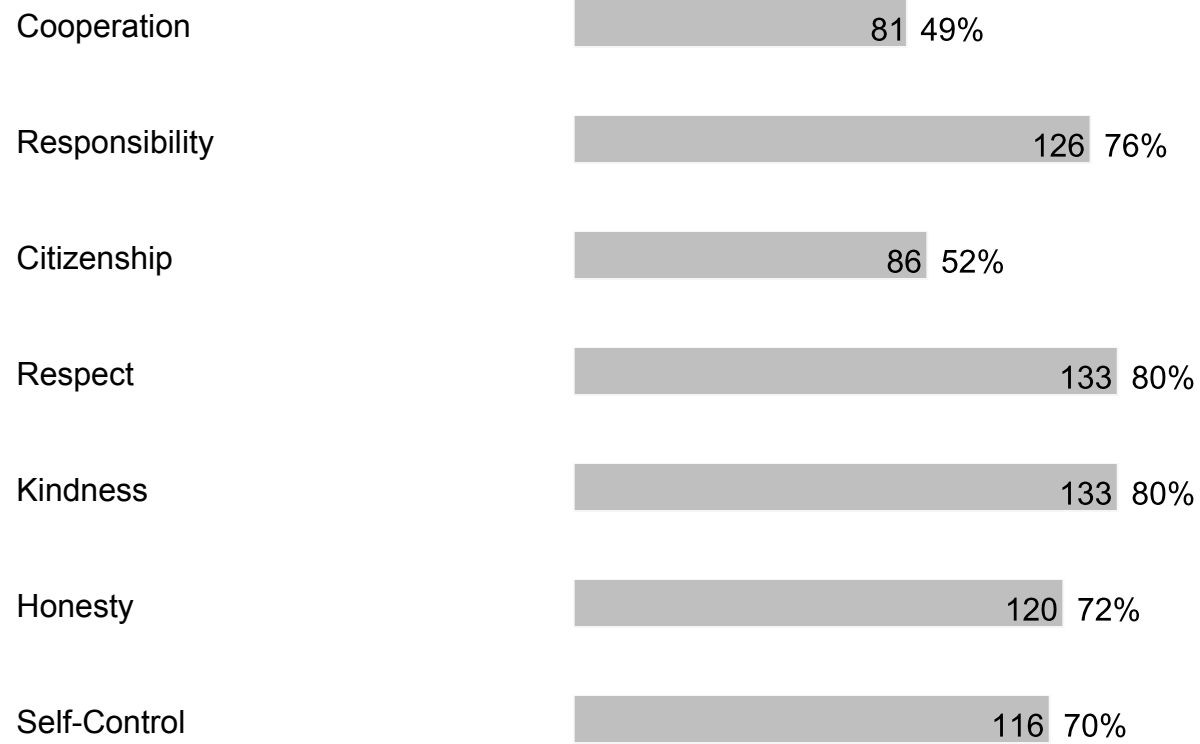

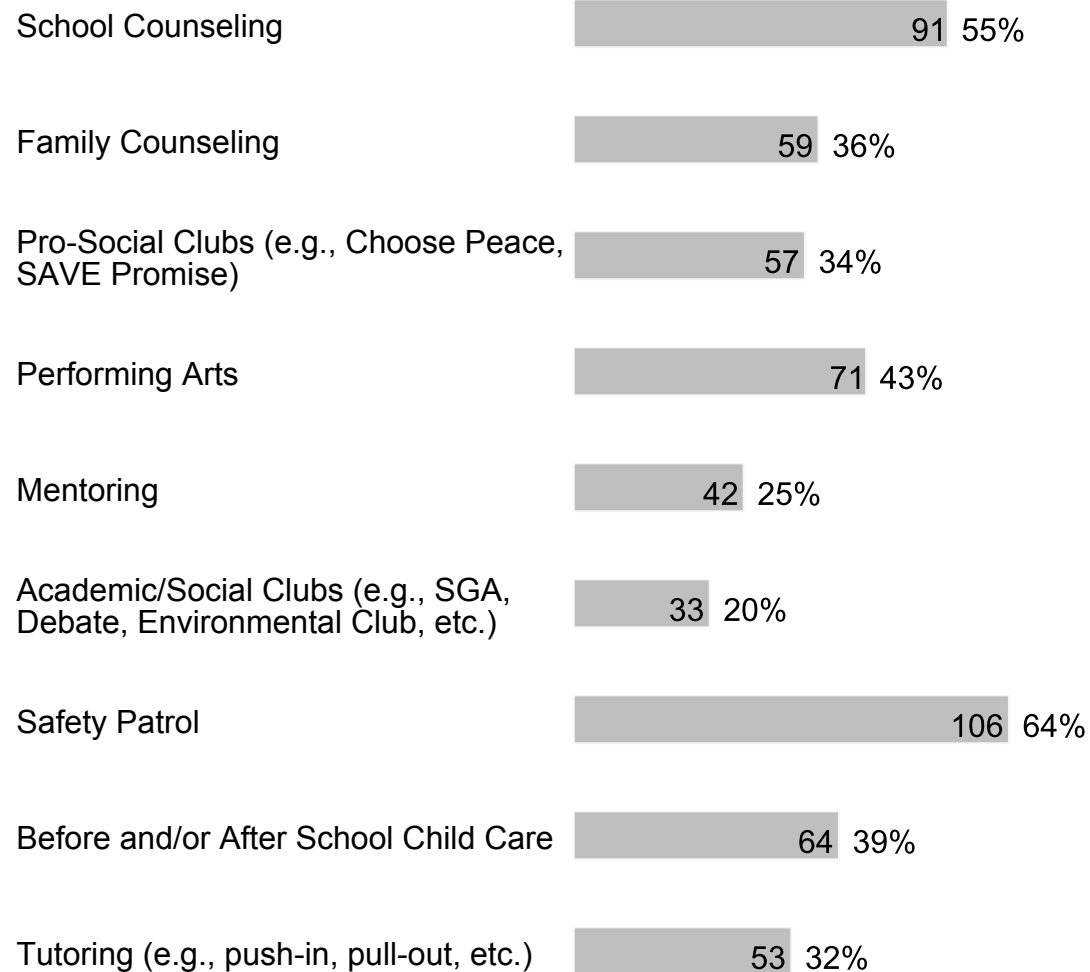

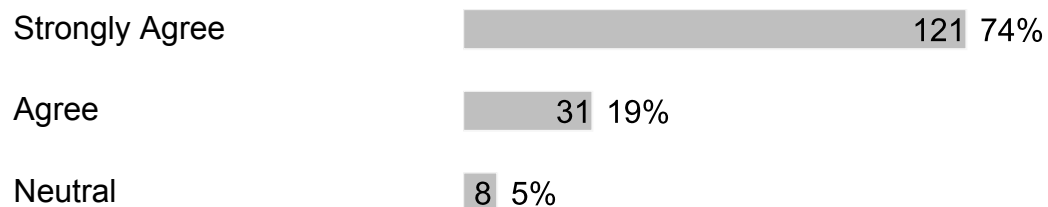

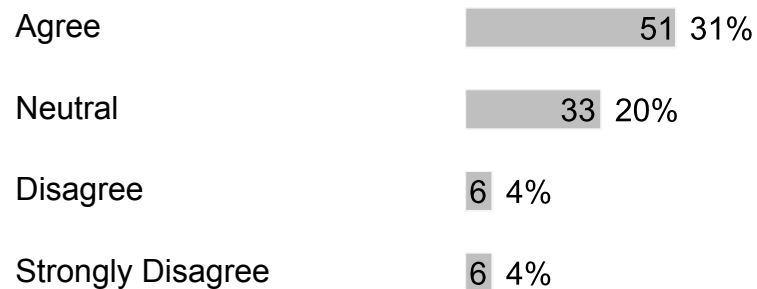

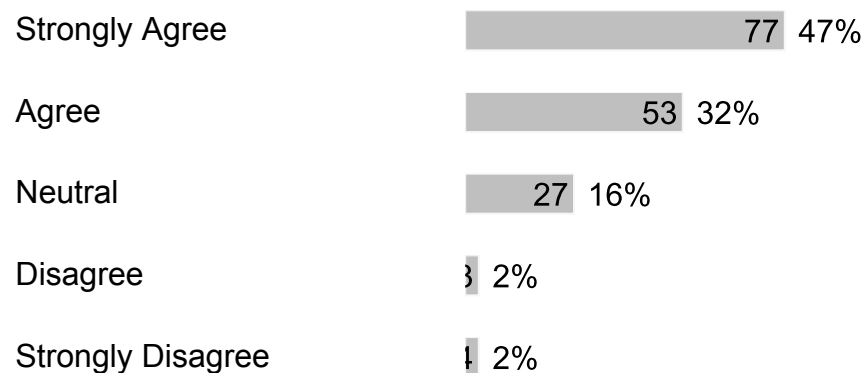

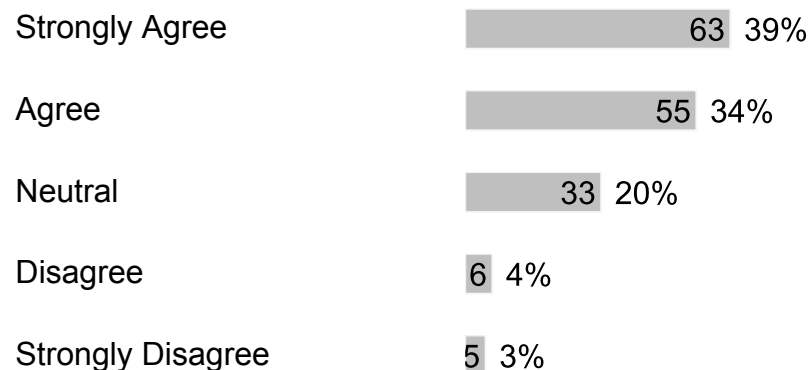

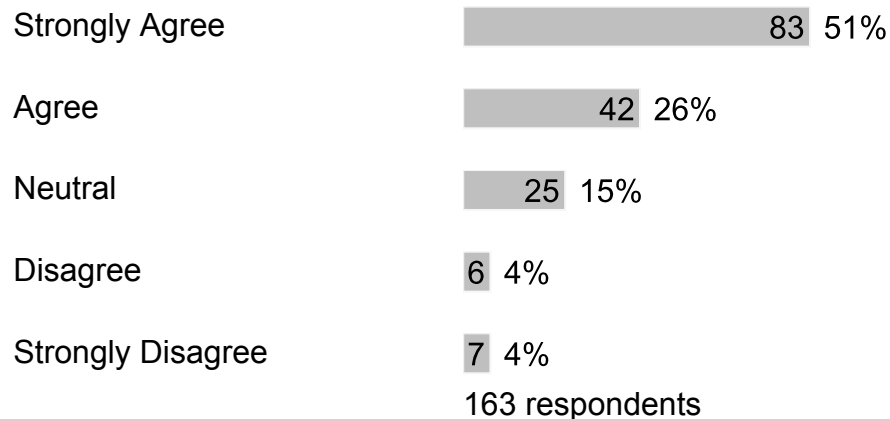

14. I actively participate in class discussions and activities.

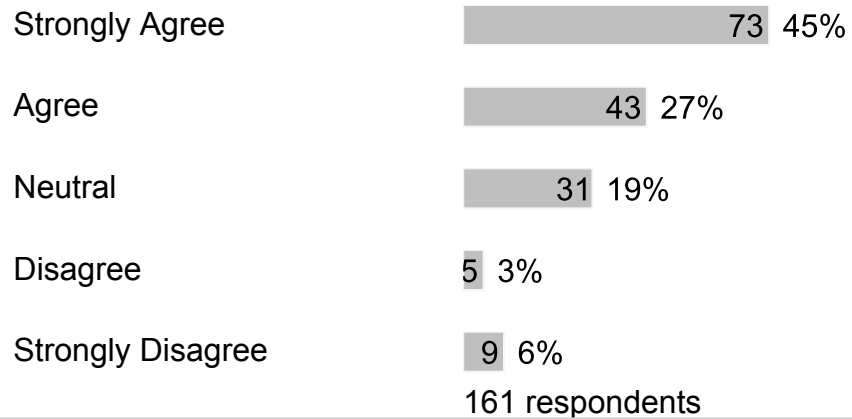

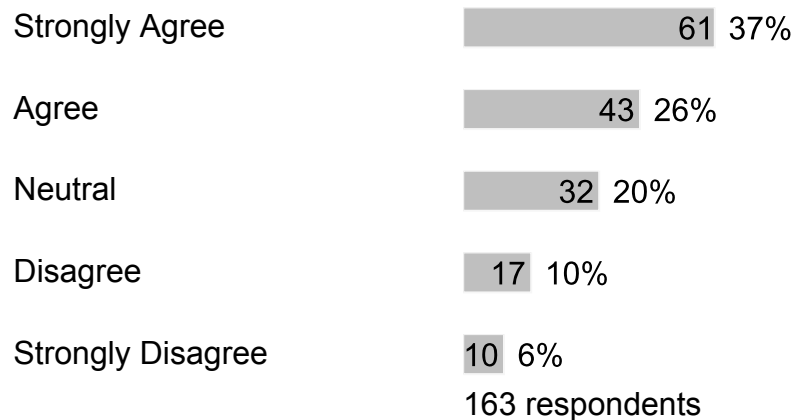
15. My teachers tell me how I should behave.



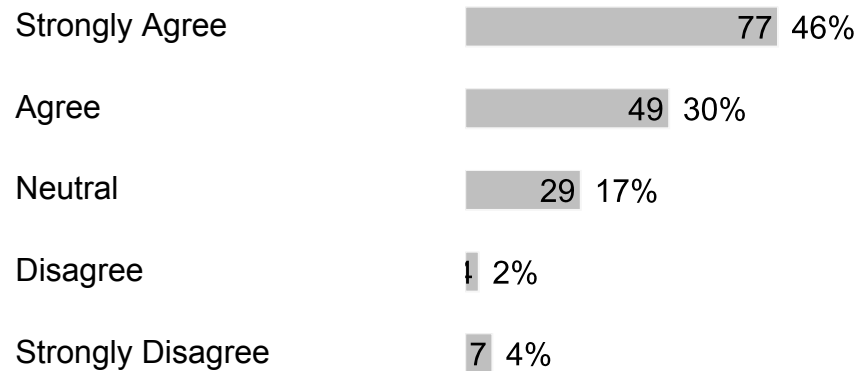
16. My teachers tell my family how I am doing in school.



17. My teachers ask my family to come to school activities.

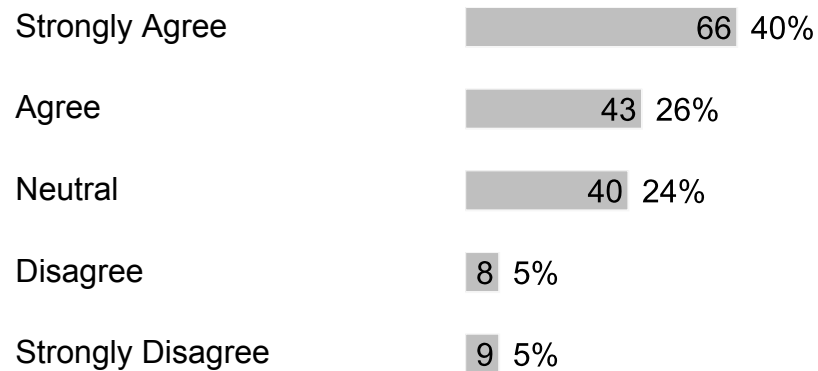


18. My teachers send information to my parents.
