<b>Item #3</b> North Area/ Dac Advisory Meeting Report	<p><b>a. Topic: Organizational Structure of the Schools District.</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ There was extensive discussion about the organizational structure of the athletic staff, as well as the role of administrators in working with teachers and the regional office. The flow chart was reviewed, including reporting lines and who each staff member reports to.</li> </ul> <p><b>b. Topic: School District Rating</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ The group also reviewed school grades across the district. It was noted that Broward County has no D- or F-rated schools, and that the number of C-rated schools has been reduced from 70 to 34. In addition, the district earned an A rating for the second consecutive year.</li> </ul> <p><b>c. Topic: School Attendance</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Attendance awards were also discussed. A question was raised about continuing to recognize students for perfect attendance from kindergarten through grade 12, which currently applies to approximately 175 students per year. This averages to about one student per school, making it a very small group. Concerns were expressed that the award may unintentionally encourage students to attend school while sick or miss important events to qualify. Given the low number of recipients and the pressure associated with meeting the requirement, it may be worth reconsidering how the award is promoted or revising the criteria.</li> </ul> <p><b>d. Topic: Change of Policy on School Banners.</b></p> <p>A mid-year change to the banner policy was discussed, following an earlier revision at the start of the school year. This new change may affect banners</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>c. Will keep you posted on changes to guidelines on perfect attendande.</li> <li>d. 	<p>that have already been ordered. Previously, banners featured a white center with two-tone colors, but the format has now been revised. The issue arose because banners were being sold to religious organizations, and the Church of Satan expressed interest in placing banners in every school in Palm Beach County. Although the statement may have been made sarcastically, the organization is still considered a legitimate entity, which created the potential for legal action. To avoid a lawsuit, Broward County proactively revised the banner policy across all schools by changing both the layout and content requirements. Under the updated policy, banners may include a logo, QR code, website, telephone number, a large school logo, and specific approved wording.</p>
