Meeting Minutes

- I. Welcome & Call to Order Kenneth Hart, Chair
 - The meeting was called to order at 5:30 PM.
 - The Pledge of Allegiance was led by members of our JROTC cadet corps.
 - Student Organization Presentation Health Science Program
 Presented by Mrs. Barnes and student representative Olivia Rivera
 - A brief overview of the Biomedical Science Program and its course offerings was provided.
- II. Approval of Minutes Ms. Pugh
 - May 7, 2025
 - A motion to approve was made by Mr. Levy, seconded by Mrs. Azim and unanimously approved @5:50pm.
 - September 3, 2025

- III. Principal's Report Mrs. Gayle
 - Testing Update:
 - Slight improvement was noted in the PM1 assessment results compared to the previous year.
 - Remediation strategies are being implemented to help students meet or exceed target goals.

- Upcoming Events & Updates:
 - The Homecoming football game is scheduled for October 30, 2025, and will be held at Chase Stadium.
 - The school has launched a swimming team, and the volleyball team is performing well this season.
 - Efforts to enhance school marketing and increase social media presence are underway.
 - Beacon will be on campus next week to produce a promotional video for the school.

FTE Survey 2:

- Scheduled for next week. Daily student attendance is essential for funding and enrollment reporting.
- Incentives have been implemented to encourage consistent attendance.

 - The bylaws were reviewed.

- c. Progress Monitoring #1 Results
 - Presented by the Curriculum Leaders.
- d. 2025-2026 School Improvement Initiatives Problem of Practice
 - Math Sebrina Brown
 - Not in attendance.
 - Literacy Dominique Key & Jasmine Lewis
 - o Shared departmental updates.
 - SMART Goal: Reach 60% proficiency in literacy by the end of the school year.
 - Current Intensive Reading Enrollment:

9th Grade: 183 students

10th Grade: 37% of the cohort

- o PM1 Results:
 - Current proficiency: 28%, a 5% increase from last year.
 - Subgroup data was analyzed; SWD (Students with Disabilities) remains the most critical area of need.

- The Literacy Coach is working closely with the ESE Specialist to provide better support.
- Only 19 seniors remain in need of meeting their reading graduation requirement.

History – Scott Fiore

- Provided an overview of the department and instructional staff.
- US History EOC Proficiency increased from 51% to 81%. The goal was 82%, reflecting a significant improvement.
- o Shared upcoming events:
 - Florida Civics Literacy Exam required for all seniors
 - Voter Registration Drive historically successful districtwide
 - Social Studies Honor Society activities

Science – Kenneth Ward

- Reviewed proficiency trends over the past four years.
- Goal: Increase biology proficiency from 70% to 75%.
- Strategies include:
 - Data chats during common planning
 - Experiential learning activities
 - Analysis of Common Formative Assessments (CFA)
 - Implementation of the 5E instructional model
 - Canvas integration
 - Enhanced accommodation for students with disabilities and language needs
- Results from CFA1 and CFA2 were discussed.

e. 2024-2025 ESSA Data Recap - Mr. Hart

- Presented growth data across various demographic groups over the past two years.
- All subgroups showed at least a 10% increase in performance across key assessments.

VI. Questions & Concerns

- Q1: How feasible is small group instruction given large class sizes?
 - o A: Through intentional differentiation and targeted instructional planning.
- Q2: How are football ticket sales allocated?
 - o Funds are deposited into the Internal Athletics account.

















SAC BYLAWS
