**Call to Order:** The School Advisory Council (SAC) meeting was called to order at 4:37 pm by Mrs. Robbi Beth Centeio.

### Principal's Report

- Testing timeline: There are six weeks remaining until FAST, Civics, and other EOC testing.
- FAST Writing begins next week. The score will not be factored into the school grade, but it is recorded in the student's FAST data. It is not a promotion criterion currently.
  - 7th grade: Tuesday 3/31
  - 6th grade: Wednesday 4/1
  - 8th grade: Thursday 4/2
- SWAG Camp resumes this Saturday. Turnout has been great; keep encouraging students to come.
- Gym renovation: They gym floor is completed and is currently curing and will be ready in 7 days.
- Weight room update- Installation is expected within 4-6 weeks. This is expand our elective offerings, training space for athletic programs, and future weight training club
- Other campus projects in progress or beginning soon
  - New field and track
  - Resurfacing of outside basketball court
  - Exterior painting
  - FPL grant for STEM lab
  - XR headsets with carts and new media center furniture from grant arriving

**School Accountability Funds:** The balance for accountability funds is \$5,014.08. Additional \$1,739 available but restricted to supplies only.

**Voting:** Quorum reached. A proposal was presented to use the \$5,014.08 for student academic pullouts during elective periods, using selected teachers whose data shows strong instructional impact. The purpose is to provide targeted support on core standards to improve student achievement before testing.

**Motion:** To approve the use of \$5,014.08 in accountability funds for student pullouts during elective periods for academic intervention.

**Vote:** Approved unanimously.

A second proposal was presented to use the \$1,739.00 supply funds for the purchase of paper.

**Motion:** To approve the use of **\$1,739.00** for paper.

**Vote:** Approved unanimously.

## Department Updates

**Social Studies:** 7th grade students completed their BSA for Civics and are preparing for the End-of-Course exam in May.

**Math:** Recent BSA results for Algebra and Geometry were positive with a high percentage of students scoring the green performance band. On pace for end of year testing.

**Science:** We are on pace and preparing for EOC exams.

**Reading:** Continuing targeted support for the lowest quartile students and collaborating closely with ELA teachers during crunch time to strengthen outcomes.

**Elective Department:** Elective offerings for next year are being reviewed and expanded in collaboration with administration.

**ELA/ Reading:** One pace and preparing for testing. MAP Growth #3 open until April 3 for intensive reading students.

**Inclusive Practices/ ESE Program:** It was shared that students in the alternate assessment program recently completed their required spring assessment.

**Media Center:** Open access Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday morning has been going well and providing students with a chance to use computers, read, research, or just relax. Book Club meets monthly.

**Title 1:** Testing Parent Support document shared and will be sent out to the school. FAST PM3 resources were prepared for distribution, and parents were encouraged to review full score reports for detailed performance data and use available online support tools

**Additional information:**

**Parent University:** Session scheduled for Tuesday, March 31 at 6:30 PM. The session will include the Superintendent and CFO and will focus on the district budget, potential reductions, and how decisions are being made. Families and advisory groups will also provide input on budget priorities.

**Community Service Discussion:** A parent raised concerns regarding how community service hours are being interpreted, specifically the practice of allowing donations or purchased items to count in place of actual service hours. The principal suggested forming a committee to continue the discussion and gather broader input from families and staff.
