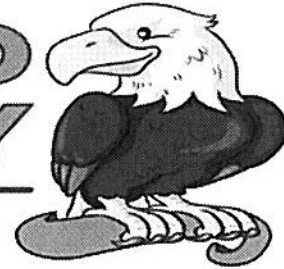

1. **Call to Order:** A meeting of the Dillard Elementary School SAC was held on Tuesday, October 28, 2025, at 5:00pm in the cafeteria. Ms. Kelly called the meeting to order at 5:00pm.
2. **Introductions and Attendance:** 18 people were present at the SAC meeting. 7 of the attendees were on the SAC committee.
3. **Approval or Correction of May 2025 meeting minutes:** A motion was made by Ms. Kelly to approve the September meeting minutes. Ms. Hodges second the motion. The minutes were approved unanimously.
4. **Reports:**
Principal Report: Mrs. Robinson welcomed all stakeholders. She addressed attendance concerns with the parents. She stated that our school was flagged last year by the district because of the school's low attendance rate. She was proud to say that this year that each grade level was above 90% in attendance for the month of October. She urged parents to make sure the students are on time for school because we have many students who are late every day. Attendance is listed in our SIP plan as one of our early warning indicators. The school is requesting \$6,000 from accountability funds for 3rd grade ELO camp. Over 60% of our 3rd grade students scored a level 1 or below on their 2nd grade end the year assessment. This year our focus will be reading. To continue to increase science scores we are asking for \$1,320.00 to purchase J and J Drill practice books in science. We tabled our vote for the use of the accountability funds until the next meeting. She also discussed our FAST goals for this year in reading, math, and science. She informed the parents about Drumline, Volta violins, gardening, and robotics. There are no SESIR reports this year at our school. Accountability funds - \$15,601.35

5. **SIP PLAN** – Ms. Kelly discussed our area of focus for our SIP PLAN is ELA. SIP will be monitored in several ways. First, it will be monitored at monthly SAC meetings with parents, business partners, and community stakeholders. Secondly, it will be monitored at monthly Literacy Meetings to ensure that students are making progress on SIP goals. Data from each Progress Monitoring Period will be used to determine if scholars are making adequate progress to meet goals on the SIP. The data from each assessment will determine revisions to the plan. Thirdly, data and progress toward SIP goals will also be monitored and shared at each faculty meeting (once a month. Ms. Kelly explained that we are a RAISE (Reading Achievement Initiative for Scholastic Excellence) school because of low student performance in ELA. 50% of our K-5 students scored below level in reading. We are receiving reading support from a state literacy director.
6. **Title 1 Updates** –
Ms. Smith presented the current School-Parent Compact and the Parent Family and Engagement Plan to parents. Ms. Smith instructed parents to review each document on their own and write down any suggestions or adjustments that need to be made. We will discuss suggestions and ideas during the November SAC meeting. We will vote to keep the Parent and Family Engagement Plan and School-Parent Compact as is or make revisions.
7. **Adjourn** – Ms. Kelly made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Mrs. Hodges second the motion. The meeting was adjourned at 5:35pm.
