School Accountability Funds

Ms. Kerobo presented multiple Title I components and requirements.

Title I Addendum / Needs and Staffing

Reviewed sections addressing the needs of the school and strategies for attracting and retaining teachers.

Parent and Family Engagement Plan (PFEP)

- Reviewed questions and sections related to ESOL and supplemental instructional services
- Discussed CEP status (all students receive free lunch)
- Free/reduced lunch population is approximately **85%**
- Reviewed the Family Engagement section, including academic nights, health and wellness events, and financial education components listed in the School and Family Engagement Plan

Parent Involvement Allocation

Approximately **\$500** remains in the parent engagement allocation for the current year. If not used, the funds will be lost (do not roll over).

- Water safety presentation via Hollywood Parks and Recreation

Events / Artifacts for PFEP Documentation

- Reviewed list of parent engagement events (e.g., Cambridge Night, Open House) that can be used as PFEP artifacts
- Clarified that Open House can be uploaded as a qualifying event when aligned to the plan
- Noted a previous ESOL night that included first-time homebuyer resources and financial literacy as a strong model to document under Health and Wellness/Financial Education, with date adjustments as needed

School–Parent Compact

Threshold Requirement: At least 75% of the school population must return signed compacts to maintain Title I Funding status.

Current Status:

- Current expectation: **66%** return by the following day
- School is presently designated **Tier 3** due to not meeting prior-year thresholds
- Tier 3 status limits travel and software allocations

Strategies to Improve Returns:

- Re-distributing compacts during lunches and collecting them immediately
- Offering small incentives (candy, chips, Eagle Bucks, extra credit) for students who return signed compacts
- Maintaining and using a list of non-returned compacts to target outreach
- Exploring parent-to-parent communication and multilingual outreach (Creole, Spanish) to ensure parents understand the importance of the compact and its impact on school resources

Title I Compliance and Tier Status

Tier status is based on timely submission and completeness of required Title I artifacts (e-binder). Failure to meet thresholds restricts certain funding and opportunities. Staff were encouraged to respond to Title I emails and submit required documentation on time.

SESIR Report (School Environmental Safety Incident Report) – Mr. Atlas

SESIR Definitions and Reporting

Mr. Atlas reviewed SESIR definitions and the types of incidents that must be reported, including:

- Alcohol
- Aggravated battery
- Arson
- Bullying
- Major disruption
- Drug sale/distribution
- Fighting
- Grand theft
- Robbery
- Sexual offenses
- Threats
- Weapons possession

Key Points:

- Only SESIR-trained staff can code and submit incidents to the state
- District-level SESIR dashboards (Broward's SESIR and FLDOE) had not yet updated with the latest data, so current-year comparisons could not be formally presented
- School-level referral volume is significantly higher than the subset that qualifies as SESIR incidents
- Most schools report roughly **5-50** SESIR incidents annually depending on size, with fighting comprising the majority
- Discussed the need for consistent monthly SESIR reporting and coordination with administrators to ensure all qualifying incidents are captured

Principal's Report –Cassandra Adderley

Assessment Completion Status

- PM2 testing for Reading and Math completed with approximately **97%** of students tested in each subject, an increase from PM1 participation
- BSA assessments for Algebra and Geometry completed; Biology testing in progress; Civics completed
- District expects reduction of "not tested" rates to ensure more accurate data, even if overall proficiency percentages may decrease

Extended Learning Opportunities (ELO)

ELO will begin after winter break with:

- **Four** ELA/Reading teachers
- **Three** math teachers
- Weekly sessions for target groups

Target Groups Include:

- Students with Disabilities (SWD)
- ESSA subgroups
- Low 30% in ELA/Math
- Algebra/Geometry students needing additional support

A deeper data review aligned to the SIP will occur at the January SAC meeting when more complete data are available.

Math Data – Instructional Coach Presentation

Overall Proficiency (Grades 6–8 Combined)

- Overall proficiency increased from **10%** to **19%** for grades 6–8 (not including Algebra students, who take a different assessment)

By Grade Level

- **Grade 6:** increased from 12% to 19% proficient
- **Grade 7:** increased from 13% to 26% proficient (approximately doubling proficiency)
- **Grade 8:** increased from 3% to 12% proficient (many 8th graders are in Algebra and take a different assessment)

Subgroups

- **Students with Disabilities (SWD):** increased from 4% to 5% proficient
- **ELL:** increased from 3% to 10% proficient

Teachers and administration noted growth trends but recognized continued need for targeted interventions.

ELA/Reading Data – Instructional Coach Presentation

Overall Proficiency (Grades 6–8 Combined)

- Proficiency increased from approximately 17% to 36% (net gain of 19 percentage points)
- Testing participation increased by one student (from 468 to 469) on PM2

By Grade Level

- **Grade 6:** increased from 27% to 36% (approximately 9-point gain)
- **Grade 7:** increased from 44% to 48% (4-point gain)
- **Grade 8:** increased from 39% to 47% (8-point gain)

Projection and Comparison

- Projected end-of-year proficiency: 55%
- Last year at PM2: 40% proficiency
- This year at PM2: 45% proficiency (5-point improvement)
- Current ELL math proficiency: 11%, with evidence of upward movement expected to continue

The team identified lowest quartile and ESSA subgroups as continued priorities for support in alignment with the SIP.

Civics Data – Department Presentation

Growth Highlights

- One teacher's classes showed growth from 5.3% to 18.4% proficiency between BSA 1 and BSA 2
- Another teacher's group (majority of 7th grade) showed 16.4% proficient with approximately 47% "on track" to proficiency

- Overall 7th-grade Civics data: **13%** proficient and **40%** on track to reach proficiency by year-end

Next Steps
