School Advisory Council (SAC) Meeting Minutes
Date: February 6, 2026

Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 8:42 a.m. by A. Sears.

Old Business

- Staff reviewed the minutes from the January 16, 2026 SAC/SAF meeting.
- R. Davis made a motion to approve the minutes with any necessary changes. R. Black seconded the motion. The motion carried, and the minutes were approved.

Reports

- Principal- No updates.
- SESIR- Per AP Pompilus, there were two SESIR reports. BTA and monitoring plans are increasing due to the rising student population. Staff were reminded to be mindful of reporting, as reports become a permanent part of student records.

New Business

- A+ Funds: Orders have been placed for student support technology, including headphones and Bluetooth speakers. Per A. Sears, remaining prior-year A+ Funds must be expended to directly support students and instructional technology. Suggested uses include No Red Ink Program, badge system upgrades, and additional technology resources. Estimated remaining balance per IT Fulwood: \$2,197.00.

Suggestions:

- Purchase ink and activate unused printer for student access (S. Grandberry)
- Implement No Red Ink program to support ELA and grammar (R. Davis)
- Update badge machine for student identification and safety (IT Fulwood)
- **Accountability Funds:** Per A. Sears, the current Accountability Funds balance is \$16,459.94, reflecting returned unused class wallet funds. 2 proposals for funds by R. Black and S. Grandberry.

Proposal #1: R. Black proposed using \$406.00 to fund travel for the PREC Boys Basketball Team to compete against other schools on February 18 and March 11. This proposal aligns with the SIP goal of exposing students to collaboration with other schools.

- **Reading Department:** Per J. Williams, 80% of students are on track to meet the 2% SIP goal. The Read for the Record initiative is upcoming.
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- **Math Department:** Per R. Davis, 38 students took PM1; current enrollment is 53 students. PM1: 12% proficient. PM2: 17% proficient. 38 Premier Bulldogs: 63% met SIP goal. 18 ESE students: 67% met SIP goal
- **ESE Specialist:** Per A. Sears, the ESE population continues to increase in alignment with overall student enrollment growth.
- **Science Department:** No updates reported.
- **Guidance Department:** No updates reported.
- **Testing Department:** No updates reported.
