School Advisory Council (SAC)

General Meeting in the New River Middle School Exploratorium on Thursday, March 5, 2026 - 4:30 PM

I. Call to Order:

A meeting of the New River Middle School Advisory Council was held in the media center. SAC Co-Chair Kimberly Youngblood called the meeting to order at **4:38PM**. Quorum was met for our meeting with 15 members present.

II. Review of Minutes: Ms. Youngblood reviews last month's general meeting minutes with the audience. Mrs. Frazier-Wright made a motion to accept the January meeting minutes. Ms. Habosha seconded the motion.

III. Principal's Report: Mrs. Harris shares Mission Possible was a great success. Mrs. Harris asks the audience for feedback, Mrs. Humphreys shares the community members were very impressed with the students' projections/presentation. Chris Hixon 5K, NRMS won 1st place for having the biggest middle school team, awarding us \$1,000. Fourth year in a row New River has won first place. We competed in our first ROV competition of the year with Mr. Lendick's class. Our inaugural mangrove planting event was last weekend on our living shoreline, where the city of Fort Lauderdale came out to see the progress we've made in our living shoreline. Mrs. Harris also shares we had quarter 2 honor roll ceremonies this past week, with the number of students receiving awards increasing from quarter 1 to quarter 2. Our Boys flag football team were division champions. Our school's average daily absences has decreased from quarter 1 to quarter 2, bringing us district recognition. Mrs. Harris also shared that after the SAC meeting's feedback from last month, we have been doing cafeteria drills for lockdowns, so students feel more comfortable/prepared. Mrs. Harris shares we need to spend all of our money; she would like to propose using 4,104.25 money to purchase lanyards, plastic badges and the cards to print the ID badges on. There are currently \$2,850 in obligations in just ID badges alone. \$720 of obligations have been paid from this year and last year. Motion to allocate remaining SAC funds of \$4,015.81 to purchase ID supplies (lanyards, badge holders, plastic cards). Second, by Mrs. Frazier-Wright. Ms. Youngblood opens the floor for discussions. Mrs. Wood asks if there is any consequence or incentive to pay obligations on our school website. Mrs. Harris shares they can't pay for a field trip unless they pay their obligation.

Roll call voting:

- a. SIP Monitoring and Feedback: Mrs. Harris shared our data from PM1 and that we have 40% proficiency in ELA and we have 20% proficiency in Math. In addition, Mrs. Harris stated that we are improving since we had 31% proficiency in ELA for PM1 last year and 16% in Math for PM1 last year. In addition she again stated that we are planning Extended Learning Opportunities

(ELO) to prepare for PM2 and PM3 and Saturday School for PM3. She asked for feedback and no none responded.

IV. School Environmental Safety and Incident Report: As of March 4th, there are 54 incidents reported.

V. Accountability Funds: Ms. Youngblood shares that currently, we have a remaining balance of \$0.

VI. Title 1 Update: Mrs. Innis shares the insight she received from the Title I parent seminar in January. Ms. Coombs also shares that the school parent compact form as been updated.

VII.SAF/I -Zone: Ms. Habosha shares more about the district hiring freeze, school closures, and the readiness of the facilities of those building that will receive new students from the closing locations.

VIII. Friends of New River: Mrs. Klink shares her gratitude to the teachers and to Mrs. Harris for donating goods to the ICU store. ICU store has relocated to the gym. The donut sales for 8th grade have collected \$500 so far. Shark Store is open Tuesdays and Fridays.

IX. New Business: Customer service surveys are open March 9th to March 15th. 7th grade field trip is now open to Busch Gardens, April 24th. 21st century, Sea Stars shares they are officially sold out of girl scout cookies, and she shares that Summer Camp is coming up and more details will come in April's meeting.

X. Meeting Adjournment: Mrs. Fraizer-Wright motions to adjourn, Ms. Dean seconds that motion. Meeting adjourned at 5:36PM.
