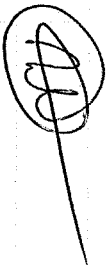

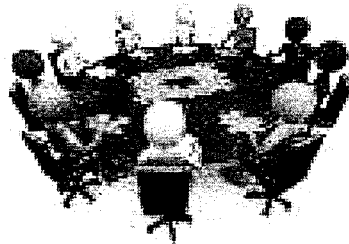

## School Advisory Council (SAC) Meeting/School Advisory Forum/Teachers Organization

### Meeting

Monday, March 23, 2026

6:00 pm



- **Welcome-**

Mr. Foster welcomed everyone to the meeting and thanked each member for their support.

- **Review/Approve January Minutes-**

Parents reviewed the minutes. Mr. Foster, the SAC chair then asked for a motion to accept the February minutes. Ms. Sumpter made the motion to accept the minutes, while Ms. Wilson seconded the motion.

- **Remarks**

Mr. Hurley (Assistant Principal) welcomed all the parents. She informed them of our district being in a hiring freeze. She also mentioned that there has been reassignment of some district roles to fill school teaching vacancies. Mrs. Hurley spoke about ELO and the importance of students taking advantage of tutoring opportunities to ensure that they score well on PM3. Parents were informed that students need at least level 2 to advance to the next grade level. Parents were also informed that summer school would be at Tropical Elementary this year.

▪ **2026-2027 School Improvement Plan Development - Mr. Foster**

Mr. Foster informed parents that our school was an “A” last year and our goal for this year is continue with this trend. Our goal for 2026-2027 is:

\***Grades K-5- 60% proficiency**

\***Grade 3- 62% proficiency**

\***Grade 4- 70% proficiency**

\***Grade 4- 65% proficiency**

\***Grade 5- 65% proficiency**

\***Learning Gains-65%**

\* **Lower Quartile-73%**

Mr. Foster also reviewed the Early Warning Systems and reviewed the area of focus for 2026-2027 school year.

\***Monitoring school-wide attendance and lateness**

\***Intentional focus on delivering differentiated classroom instruction, facilitating student academic discourse and maintaining academic rigor**

\***Increase learning gains through intensive data-driven instruction utilizing district approved intervention resources as well as ELO tutoring.**

Other areas of the School Improvement Plan included the school’s budget, Title 1 addendum, MTSS/Rti and the state’s report card detailing the school’s grade for the past 3 years. Mr. Foster then asked parents for any input they would like to see added/deleted to the SIP for 2026-2027 school year.

**Parent Input:** The plan was unanimously accepted without any additional changes.

• **2026-2027 Parents and Family Engagement Plan Development - Clarke**

Ms. Clarke discussed the importance of parent engagement through family participation in various schoolwide programs such as Kindergarten Round-up, Open House, Head Start Meet & Greet, Curriculum Nights (Both ELA, and Math), and STEM Museum Night. She thanked the parents for their ongoing support and urged them to keep participating. She then distributed the current school year FEPP plan and asked parents to take a few minutes to read it again and review it. Ms. Clarke then presented a draft of the upcoming school year's FEPP plan.

She distributed copies of the draft and then opened the floor for parent input.

- **Parent Input**

- \*A suggestion was made by one parent to add Science as a part of the curriculum night considering that 5<sup>th</sup> graders are assessed in this area.

- \*Many parents expressed their appreciation for having a Creole and Spanish translator during SAC/SAF/PTO meetings.

- \*One thing that was suggested to help improve parent attendance in school activities was to update the school website to include current activities. Mail by the school system was another concern. One parent suggested that there be various forms of contact aside from Class Dojo and robo calls and flyers.

- **2026-2027 School-Parent Compact Development- Ms. Clarke**

Ms. Clarke then discussed the importance of reviewing the School Parent-Compact which is given at the beginning of the year for parents to sign. She then distributed a printed copy to the parents. She talked with parents about the involvement of parents and students to help make that whole child. Hence the reason for the 'School Compact Form. She reviewed the current school year compact discussing the section that spoke about the school responsibilities such as providing high-quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment, increasing student achievement in reading, writing, and math, collaborating with parents, teachers, and the community, and the importance of core values. She reviewed other teacher/school responsibilities such as having a teacher-parent conference at least twice a year and providing frequent progress monitoring through report cards and interims. She told parents that conferences are held at 7:30 am or 2:15 pm after dismissal. Parent responsibilities were addressed such as attending monthly parent meetings/parent nights, and having students come to school prepared with the necessary school supplies. Monitoring on-time attendance was addressed and the importance of completing homework and limiting screen/T.V. time.

Ms. Clarke then distributed a draft of the upcoming school year parent compact in various languages. Parents reviewed. Ms. Clarke then opened the floor for parents' input.

**Parent Input-**There was no parent concerns/feedback.

- **2026-2027 Parent and Family Engagement Survey Review- Ms. Clarke**

Ms. Clarke reviewed the PFEP survey results. She informed the parents number of parents who had already completed the survey. She thanked the parents. Ms. Clarke reported that 95 out of 554 students have finished the survey. This is over the 10% needed for Title I. Ms. Clarke distributed copies of the results. A few high percentages of strongly agree were sections 1-23. However, the school fell on the updating of the website and sending mail by post to parents. Ms. Clarke discussed that some parents still struggle with digital resources like focus. However, if parents need hard copies of interims or report cards, it is always available. Mrs. Hurley explained that the website is updated by a third part and the school is working on getting Ms. Morris access to updating information on the website. She also distributed the QR code to parents who did not complete the survey and those who were still interested can still complete it. She then opened the floor for parents' input.

**\*Parent input:**

One parent asked if it was possible for paper copies of the survey to be given to parent next time for input. Ms. Clarke stated that she would enquire about this.

- **School Environment Safety Incident Report (SESIR)**

Mrs. Hurley reminded parents of the importance of students refraining from using threatening words to classmates even if it's a joke. She also emphasized, the "If You See Something, Say Something" policy that we enforce at our school. She also informed parents of the importance of checking their child's backpacks and making sure they are not bringing objects that are prohibited in school.

- **Comments and Concerns:**
