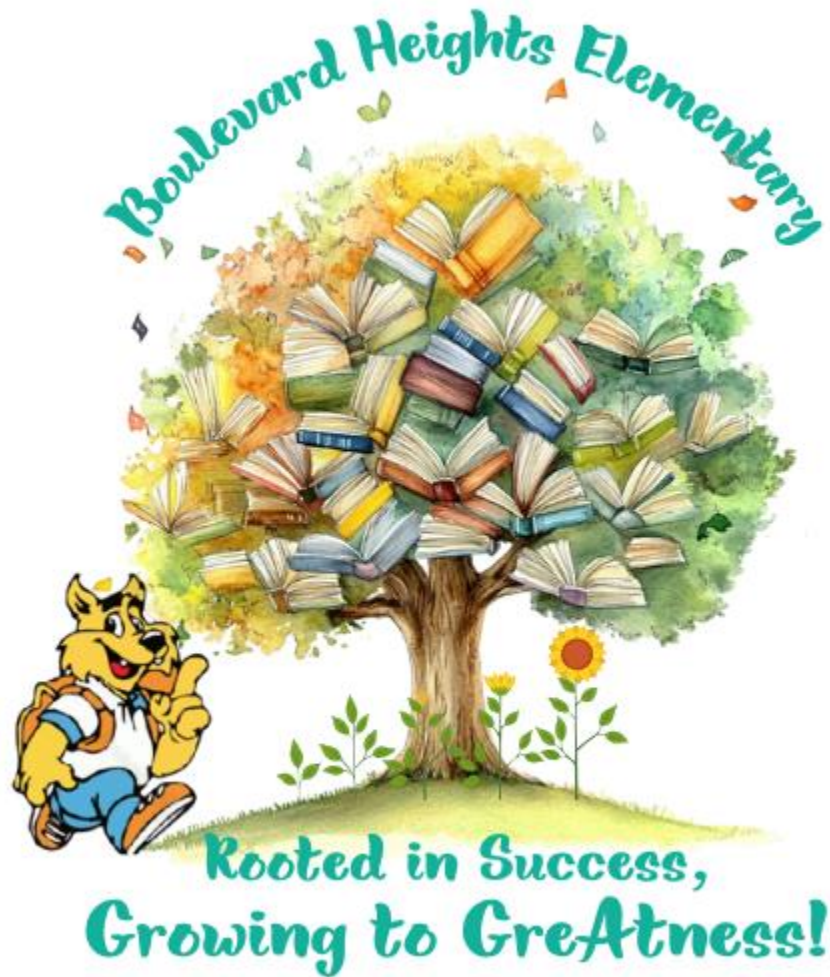

Title1 Updates-Mrs. Garcia

Mrs. Garcia stated she was talking about several different points today about Title 1.

DATA/Mid-Year Review

Math Proficiency-After PM2 our data reflects 18% which is (39/212) students of grades 3-5 were proficient in Math after PM2 which our goal is 60%.

Math Learning Gains- Currently we are at 11% and our goal is 60%.

Math Lowest Quartile- students is 23% and our goal is 60%.

ELA Proficiency-The data for PM2 also shows 34% which is (72/212) percent of 3-5 students in ELA proficient.

3rd grade ELA Proficiency- Currently, they are at 30% of proficiency and or goal is 50% proficiency.

ELA Learning Gains- Currently we are at 27% and our goal is 70%.

ELA Lowest Quartile Students- Currently we are at 14% and our goal is 70%.

Mid-year instructional review was a success where district employees from different areas of expertise such as Math, ESOL, ESE and director came to our school to discuss data, see the classroom instruction, and discuss action steps that will be taking place based on data that was shared.

Instruction has shifted to new action steps in Math which was created by the Math Coach in conjunction with the Math district department to assist our action plan in Phase 2. Teachers will be remediating students individually targeting what is needed based on their data from PM2 results in Math. For ELA, were using Magnetic I-ready books to assist students further in the standards that are being taught through Benchmark Advance.

ELO and Specials camp have started for students in grades 3-5, based on PM2 data and will be remediated by our coaches and or teachers that can provide support.

Instructional coaches will be co-teaching with teachers and will be pulling and or pushing into classrooms to support teachers and students in the classrooms.

Everyone is working hard to ensure all our students get the best possible education.

(B5) 2026-2027 School Improvement Plan (SIP) with Title 1 Addendum was explained to parents to ensure that BHE families were aware of the SIP. Parents were reminded that is it on our BHE website. There was a discussion regarding the SIP. Parents were given the opportunity to suggest changes to the SIP with the Title 1 addendum for the upcoming

school year. Parental input was asked for; none was given. Changes were not suggested at this time.

(F4) Parental Involvement Allocation- Parental Involvement Allocation was explained to parents. There was a discussion. Parents were advised that we have funds to allocate. Parents were asked for input on the money and how it should be spent for the 26-27 school year. Parents expressed approval for previous Parental Involvement Allocation through BHE family events and activities. Parental input was asked for regarding the Parent Involvement Allocation; none was given. Parents and community members stated the current Parental Involvement Allocation is effective and had NO Concerns for the upcoming school year.

(G4)- the 25-26 School-Parent Compact copies were distributed on all 3 languages and shared with parents and community members. The parent compact was reviewed with parents. There was a discussion. Everyone was reminded that the families received a copy at the beginning of the school year. They also received another one at the Title One Night/Open House Night. The reasoning for Title 1 Compacts was explained. Parents and community members were given the opportunity to make changes. Parents reviewed and suggested we added, “BHE will have a School Dojo as another form of communication and the QR code to invite parents will be on the school website.” That was the only suggestion parents gave to the compact for the upcoming school year.
