I. Welcome & Call to Order	Our school advisory council meeting was called to order at 8:23am. Ms. Moore and Ms. Osgood called the meeting to order and greeted all the guests.
II. Review of May 2025 Minutes	The May 2025 Minutes were reviewed by Ms. Osgood. The May meeting consisted of debriefing the parents about the end-of-year matriculation meetings and our summer programs being held on campus. We also discussed the allocation of our accountability funds from the 2024-2025 school year.
III. Annual Ratification of SAC/SAF By-Laws	Mrs. Moore, our co SAC-Chair, debriefed the committee on our SAC/ SAF Bylaws. We held a vote for our two SAC co-Chairs, Mrs. Moore and Ms. Osgood. *All were in favor with a vote of 10.
IV. Election of Officers	Secretary- Ms. Cross I-Zone Representative- Ms. Perry Community/ Business Representative- Ms. Teresa Spittler, YMCA SAF Chair- Ms. Valeria Crayle *All were in favor with a vote of 10.
V. Current School Wide Data Review	Ms. Osgood reviewed our curriculum for intensive classrooms. We implement Unique Learning System (ULS) into our intensive classroom routine and structure. The Unique Learning System is a standards-based curriculum designed for students with significant disabilities. For Pre-K, it provides developmentally

	<p>appropriate, differentiated instruction that supports emergent literacy, communication, math, and social-emotional growth.</p> <p>The Unique Learning System benchmark assessments measure student growth across literacy, math, and foundational skills for students with significant cognitive disabilities. The assessments are differentiated into three levels to reflect student abilities and ensure access to meaningful, standards- aligned evaluation.</p> <p>Summary: Levels 1-3 ensure students are assessed according to their abilities:</p> <p>Level 1- Foundational engagement Level 2- Emerging symbolic understanding Level 3- Early independent literacy and math skills</p>
<p>VI. School Improvement Plan</p>	<p>Ms. Jones, our assistant principal, informed the committee of our 2025-2026 school improvement plan. The plan states by May 2026, 80% of PreK students will independently or with prompting use at least five targeted core words across two settings (literacy block and play centers), documented through teacher data collection and communication logs.</p>
<p>VII. School Environmental Safety Incident Report (SESIR)</p>	<p>Ms. Freeman, our principal, debriefed the committee on our SESIR. These are incidents that are reported and documented to the state of Florida. These incidents will need to be reported to the committee and families to inform them what is happening on our campus. There have been no incidents reported.</p>

Principal Updates</p>	<p>Ms. Freeman, our principal, informed the committee of events that took place or will take place on campus.</p> <p>Dad's Take their Child to School Day happened on September 13th. Grandparent's Day took place on September 18 and there was a great turnout. Thank you to all the families for their engagement at both events.</p>
