**Call to order:** The meeting was called to order by Darren Stokes, at 12:33pm.

#### **New Business: SAF Chair Report: Renae Kraus**

- The Central Advisory Council meetings in November and December 2025 addressed legislative curriculum changes, student support services, safety measures, and organizational updates for the school district.
- Phoenix Declaration curriculum adoption: All Florida school districts must conform to the Phoenix Declaration curriculum by August 2026, requiring all students to pass exams on this content without additional funding for compliance. Concerns were raised about politicization and restrictions on factual content.
- Student support and safety updates: Enhanced mental health supports, trauma-informed care, wellness centers, and college readiness resources were highlighted. Safety improvements include vaping detection rollout, intercom and camera repairs, and staffing or locking school gates.
- Operational and organizational decisions: A hiring freeze was announced with critical vacancies to be filled internally. The Title I qualification threshold will revert to 50% due to immigration concerns affecting meal benefit applications.
- The STHS PTSO will be holding their first meeting on Tuesday, January 27, 2026, at 6:00PM in the STHS cafeteria.
