Call to order, Introductions, Attendance: The meeting was called to order by Darren Stokes, at 11:41am and self-introductions were made.

New Business:

Director's Report: Cara Daniel

- **SkillsUSA Florida State Conference:** Students earned 17 total medals (6 Gold, 5 Silver, 6 Bronze) across postsecondary and high school programs. Students advancing to the National Competition in Atlanta, Georgia.
- **School Accountability Funds:** \$4,600 available for the current school year.
- **BCPS News:** District-wide school closures and operational downsizing are creating uncertainty. Potential staffing impacts at Sheridan will depend on district projections, surplus/layout rights, and union contract guidelines (BTU/FOPE). Staff will be notified directly if reductions occur.
- **CTE Expansion:** Possible postsecondary expansion to Palm Cove Elementary. Expansion proposal to be shared with a school board member by district leadership.
- **Main Campus Construction:** The Main Campus is undergoing several significant Building Envelope Improvements as part of the SMART Bond Program.

SIP Monitoring, Stakeholder Feedback, & High School Report: Wendolynn Mola

- **26-27 Positive Behavior Plan:** A Schoolwide Behavior Plan meeting took place, where staff reviewed discipline data comparing last year to this year. The draft plan was sent to all staff for review, with voting scheduled for Monday. Discipline referrals have risen from about 30 to 55, mainly for disobedience, profanity, cheating, and unauthorized campus departures; most incidents involved 9th grade students.
- Outlined academic supports: reading pull-outs, new reading and math enrichment classes, and high dosage tutoring for Algebra 1 students. Announced new AP Cybersecurity class for 9th graders and changes in technology and financial literacy instruction.

Council of Occupational Education (COE): Mary Barba

- The Annual Report has been submitted and is currently under review. Updates are being made to our current programs that have made changes, such as delivery method or increase in program length. Everything must be reported to FLDOE and COE.
- Recent initiatives include professional development for faculty and a data drive to improve placement and completion rates.

Assistant Director Reports:

Mary Barba reported that cosmetology programs are at full capacity and CDE programs are waitlisted, we have more students interested than we have space. Ongoing campus projects: HVAC, elevator updates, lighting, PA systems, and security cameras.

Barrett Goldman reported that Ford Asset program will be presented to the board this time next month. Partnership with Southeast Toyota to establish a training center on the main campus. At the West campus, the Diesel program has a huge waitlist. All automotive programs will be reaccredited in the next six months, along with accreditation of Mazda and Diesel programs. Accounting will be available next year to STHS and CDE students as a technical program option.

Jose Laverde shared that health sciences students are at clinicals and preparing for industry certifications, 50 high school EKG students and 20 PCT students will be testing. Nursing students started the new term this week with 24 new students and a new Nursing instructor on the team. ESOL enrollment remains steady and will be starting the new term next week.

Safety and Security/SESIR and Nominating Committee: Jose Laverde

- We have two new security specialists, one assigned to the main campus and one to the high school.
