## SAC Meeting Minutes – January 6th, 2026

### A. Welcome, Call to Order, Attendance

Ms. Gomez welcomed everyone and called the meeting to order at 8:29 am and conducted a quorum check which was deemed successful.

### B. Minutes from December 6<sup>th</sup>, 2026 – Ms. Hanson

- The minutes of December's meeting were read. The motion to approve the minutes was made by Mr. Naylor and seconded by Mrs. Sotus. The minutes were accepted as read.

### • Minutes from November 4<sup>th</sup>, 2025 – Ms. Allen

Ms. Allen presented a summary of the November meeting minutes, which had not previously been approved due to the lack of a quorum at the December meeting. Mr. Naylor made a motion to approve the minutes as read, which was seconded by Ms. Bridget. The voting members unanimously approved the motion.

### C. SIP Monitoring/Feedback

- Ms. Allen clarified the third-grade ELA goals using students' second-grade end-of-year proficiency data, which showed a baseline of 29%. She reiterated that increasing proficiency from 32% to 34% is a realistic target and noted that all other goals remain in place and are being closely monitored.

### D. Grade Projection

- Ms. Allen reviewed the grade projection table, which displays three years of trend data across each school grading category. The table also highlights current proficiency and learning gains targets and indicates that meeting these goals would result in the school earning a "B" grade.

### E. School Accountability Funds

- She informed the members that \$5,438.34 had been deposited into the school's account and designated as school accountability funds.

### F. Budget Request

- **There was no budget request.**

### G. SESIR

- We had no new SESSIR reports for the month of December. These SESSIR incidents involve the police and must be reported to the State, and all Fire Drills and active assailant drills are being conducted in accordance with the district's schedule.

#### H. SAC/SAF Meeting Dates

- Ms. Allen reminded the parents of the remaining meeting dates. She also promised to send a Parent Link reminding parents of the February 3<sup>rd</sup> meeting.

#### I. North Region Advisory Forum Meeting Dates

- Ms. Allen announced that the next meeting is scheduled for January 15, 2026, at 6:15 p.m. at Monarch High School. She also informed attendees that SAF meetings are open to the public; however, Mr. Andrew Rifkin serves as the school's designated parent representative and is authorized to attend on behalf of the school and vote on the matters presented.

#### J. Reports

##### ❖ Title 1 Reports – Lisa Palonka

- Ms. Palonka informed attendees about the upcoming Title I Parent Seminar, scheduled for January 31, 2026, at the Marriott Hotel in Coral Springs, from 8:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. She encouraged parents to attend, highlighting it as an excellent opportunity to gain resources and valuable knowledge on a variety of topics.

##### ❖ Principal's Report – Ms. Allen

- **Enrollment** - Current enrollment, including VPK, was 388 students, compared to a projected 364. She informed attendees that the school had received six new registrations and noted that enrollment fluctuates due to both new registrations and withdrawals.
- **Help needed** - Ms. Allen reiterated the initiatives planned for the remainder of the school year and shared that a local realtor had expressed interest in "adopting" the school, pledging to purchase items from our wish list. She also informed attendees that a representative from Fat Freddy's had provided bookbags filled with Christmas gifts for students. Ms. Allen promised to update the council with a list of remaining items after the realtor's contributions are received.
- **Testing Update**  
Ms. Allen stated that FAST PM2 was scheduled for December 2<sup>nd</sup> to December 12<sup>th</sup> for K-5 and that we were currently in the process of completing makeup testing which will continue through January 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2026.

- **Teacher Training and Assistance**

Ms. Allen noted that teacher training is ongoing, with sessions focused on testing protocols, the Science of Reading, and various curriculum areas.

**K. City of Oakland Park Report – Ms. Bridget Pierce**

Ms. Bridget shared the following updates regarding the COP Aftercare.

- Current enrollment stands at 136 students, with a few openings remaining in 4th and 5th grades, while other grade levels have waitlists. She noted that 125 of the enrolled students receive a grant that provides parents with a subsidized rate for tuition.
- Although 180 students registered for Winter Break Camp, daily attendance consistently remained in the low 100s.
- The city will host an MLK Day event on January 17, 2026, in honor of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. The event is free and open to the public.
- Soul Fest is scheduled for 2/6/26 and is also a free event.
- Taste of Oakland Park is set for February 20, 2026. Tickets, priced between \$10 and \$15, can be purchased online and provide attendees with unlimited food and beverage tastings.
- The City Office has relocated to the new City Hall, and all registrations will now take place at this location.

**L. Old Business**

- There was no unfinished business.

**M. New Business**

**PM2 Test Data – Ms. Smith**

- Ms. Smith presented an analysis of the FAST PM2 K–5 assessment data, including proficiency levels for STAR Literacy, STAR Reading, ELA, and Math. She also shared a comparison report highlighting PM2 results from the 2024–2025 school year alongside current-year data, as well as cohort trends from the 2024–2025 kindergarten class through this year's fifth-grade students.
- Ms. Smith emphasized that third grade is a critical area of focus and noted that targeted support, including push-in services, have been implemented to help close achievement gaps across all third-grade classrooms. She also explained that intermediate students were identified based on their PM2 scaled scores and proximity to proficiency and learning gains targets. Additionally, she outlined the number of students being targeted per grade level in ELA and Math and shared that these students will be invited to participate in extended-day learning opportunities.

- Mr. Rifkin asked about the timeline for students receiving their computers. Ms. Allen shared that the district recently provided a list of students whose parents opted for, and the team is currently updating the devices. She also noted that parents will be notified once the devices are ready to be sent home.
