SAC Meeting Minutes

January 27, 2026

Welcome/ Role Call to Establish Quorum:

Mr. Duverneau warmly welcomed all SAC members and expressed his heartfelt wishes for a successful and prosperous New Year. He also took a moment to thank everyone for their dedication throughout the year 2025.

Approval of Minutes

Mr. Duverneau read the minutes, which were approved by Mr. Mosley and seconded by Ms. Wendy.

Principal Updates

Mr. Gibson began by wishing everyone Happy Year. Then, he highlighted Palmview's accomplishments to the teachers and staff's remarkable collaborative spirit. Mr. Gibson emphasized the importance of teamwork in fostering collegiality and creating an environment that maximizes student learning. He also talked and discussed the PM2 results for both ELA and Math. We are about 41-43% in ELA and Math. He said that Palmview students performed better in this year's PM2 than previous year. Mr. Gibson commended the teachers and students for their outstanding performance. He noted that coaches had already formulated support plans to help teachers and students maintain the "A."

Mr. Gibson reiterated the school's plan to do well on this year's science test. Therefore, Mr. Duverneau continues to facilitate the morning science lab for most 5th-grade students. Ms. Grandfield works closely with all teachers to ensure quality science instruction in every classroom.

Mr. Gibson strongly emphasized the critical importance of reading, encouraging parents to ensure their children read daily. He reminded everyone that reading is foundational not only to literacy but also to other subjects like math and science. He also encouraged parents to have students use iReady daily at home.

School Improvement Plan

Mr. Duverneau outlined the comprehensive crunch-time plan for ELA, Math, and Science, designed to provide additional support to both teachers and students. In Reading and Math, the school aims for at least 70% of students to achieve proficiency. Additionally, Mr. Duverneau briefly addressed the importance of attendance and parental involvement, highlighting their critical roles in student success. He reminded parents that consistent attendance is essential, urging students to be present daily unless they are genuinely ill. Furthermore, Mr. Duverneau encouraged parents to attend parent-teacher conferences at least twice a year to stay informed about their children's academic progress. He stressed that parents should be fully aware of their child's promotion or potential retention status well before June, ensuring a collaborative effort to support student achievement.

Community Involvement

Mr. Duverneau expressed his heartfelt gratitude to all the dedicated volunteers who contributed their time and effort to make our snow cone and popcorn event successful. This event ran smoothly and brought great joy to the students, who thoroughly enjoyed the treats and the fun atmosphere. Their smiles and excitement were a testament to the event's success. It reminds us of all that a strong sense of community plays a crucial role in our school's ongoing success and vibrancy. We continue to build a supportive and thriving environment for everyone involved.
