

## **SAF**

- There was a presentation on College and Career Readiness
- There are scholarships not only available to H.S. but some for other grades
- Zello Game- K-2 - focus on Careers, grades 3-5 goes more into salaries- it will tailor to students interest.
- The primary digital hub for Broward County Public Schools (BCPS) high school students is the **Focus Student Information System**, accessible at [browardschools.com/focus](http://browardschools.com/focus). It allows students and parents to view schedules, track grades, monitor attendance, and receive school updates
- School Choice Transportation – Considering condensing bus stops and having the option for school choice students. Ex Nova going from 80 to 30 buses
- Meta Glasses – not permitted during testing or in school. Working on a policy
- Proposed Referendum – working on how funding will be used. – majority for salaries, social services, and safety

- Working on School Wide positive behavior plan
