SESIR-School Environment Safety Incident Reporting



- The School Environmental Safety Incident Reporting (SESIR) System currently collects data on 26 incidents of crime, violence, and disruptive behaviors that occur on school grounds, on school transportation, and at off-campus, school-sponsored events, during any 24-hour period, 365 days per year.

Incidents are reported by schools to the districts which, in turn, provide the data to the DOE. Per F.S. 1002.20, parents of public-school students have a right to access school safety and discipline incidents as reported pursuant to [s. 1006.07\(9\)](#). - Membership Explanations: DAC representatives must attend monthly DAC meetings to maintain their seat. After 3 absences, the seat is vacated.
- September minutes approved unanimously with motion by Mark Foxwell, seconded by Melissa Million.

School Spotlight by I-Zone:

Updates:

Facilities updates provided, including the redefining initiative last week. We need report assessments from all schools ensuring the money is being spent correctly. Maximo needs to be working.

Advisory council had many concerns from parents about the redefining process, vape detection and SAC funds how they won't be received this year completely. Schools are requesting that a nurse be provided in every school. ESE advises, inappropriate action in which parents are required to pick up students.

Lunch applications are still open tied to Title I. At least one school has lost support staff due to Title I funding being reduced due to the lack of applications being completed. Angel funds and district funds are being looked at. Money is being accepted in cash. They also want to look into the Hazel health program, which is no longer being available. We need to provide more resources to parents.
