Referendum discussion: The Referendum will be placed on the ballot for school-based salaries in November. Broward is anticipating 1,000 layoffs and attrition. 5 schools are closing in Broward, and those students and staff members will be placed throughout the district.

Parental input:

A parent asked if an elementary school could become a Magnet school. Ms. Rippo explained that Nova has a robust robotics program and that we do innovative programs, but we are not officially a Magnet Program. There are other Magnet programs in the district. Nova is a special program that is contracted from Nova, and if necessary, the program will expand to become officially a Magnet program.

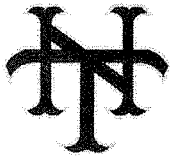

SESIR-School Environment Safety Incident Reporting



- The School Environmental Safety Incident Reporting (SESIR) System currently collects data on 26 incidents of crime, violence, and disruptive behaviors that occur on school grounds, on school transportation, and at off-campus, school-sponsored events, during any 24-hour period, 365 days per year.

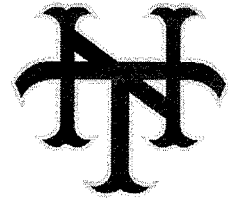
Incidents are reported by schools to the districts which, in turn, provide the data to the DOE. Per F.S. 1002.20, parents of public-school students have a right to access school safety and discipline incidents as reported pursuant to **s. 1006.07(9)**. To view the state reported discipline data:

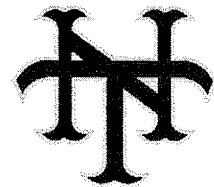

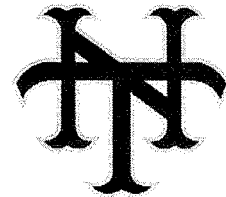
