




Meeting Adjournment:











- Each advisory council is required to be composed of the principal and an appropriately balanced number of teachers, education support employees, parents, and other business and community citizens.

SESIR-School Environment Safety Incident Reporting



- The School Environmental Safety Incident Reporting (SESIR) System currently collects data on 26 incidents of crime, violence, and disruptive behaviors that occur on school grounds, on school transportation, and at off-campus, school-sponsored events, during any 24-hour period, 365 days per year.

Incidents are reported by schools to the districts which, in turn, provide the data to the DOE. Per F.S. 1002.20, parents of public-school students have a right to access school safety and discipline incidents as reported pursuant to s. 1006.07(9). To view the state reported discipline data:

10

Kindergarten



Math: We finished learning to count from 0 to 5, now we are learning how to count, make, and write numbers 6 through 10.

Science: We are wrapping up unit 1: All About Matter. This unit discusses how various properties such as color, shape, size, texture, etc., can be used to sort objects. This unit also explains that properties can be changed by smashing, cutting, or tearing.

ELA: We have been focusing on the different needs that plants and animals need to survive. The letter and sound for M was our focus for week 2 and HFW was "I". For week 3, we are focusing on the letter and sound for "A". HFWs are "like" and "I".

11

1st Grade



First Grade has been working hard this quarter!

ELA: We are continuing to learn about how plants and animals grow and change.

Working on short vowel sounds and writing narratives and opinions.

Science: We have been learning about objects and how they move.

Math: We are working on understanding adding facts within 20.

Social Studies: We have been learning about What is Time? (timelines)

12

2nd Grade



ELA: We are on Unit 2 in Benchmark. In this unit students will read stories in a range of genres including fables, fairytales and realistic fiction, in which characters must confront and overcome a problem. For phonics, we are targeting skills on long o, e and i sounds.

Math: We are wrapping up topic 3, adding sums to 100. This topic we are setting a strong foundation of exposing students to different strategies they can use to add such as using a hundred chart, a number line, the break apart method, mental math and compensation.

Science: We are exploring Unit 1, Materials and Changes, learning about how to classify certain objects, by color, texture, weight, etc. We will continue to dive into more properties of matter and defining key terms such as what is a solid and liquid.

13

3rd Grade



With beginning of the year testing concluding, 3rd grade is looking forward to full, uninterrupted engagement in the teaching and learning process.

In 3rd grade, we...

ELA: Concluded a unit on analyzing the features of informational text. We are currently learning about the features of literary texts, such as analyzing fables for structure, developing a theme, and summarizing. We are also exploring the features of poetry.

Math: We are continuing our work with multiplication strategies as we finish up Topic 3 focused on applying properties of multiplication. We will continue to engage in ongoing practice focused on multiplication fact fluency.

Social Studies: We have learned about tools used to navigate the world, such as maps. We have explored types of maps and their purpose, i.e., population and political maps.

Science: We are thrilled to begin work on an animal adaptations research project that joins the work we did in our ELA Benchmark Advance Unit 1 curriculum with our science standards. We are also learning all about matter in our core science textbook.

4th Grade

Math: Using basic facts and other multiplication strategies to multiply greater numbers by one-digit numbers.

ELA: Practicing reading skills to understand how characters' actions and reactions influence a story's plot including theme, as well as other characters.

Science: describing how matter changes forms, understanding the differences between physical and chemical changes.

Social Studies: Students will compare the Native American tribes in Florida, including, Apalachee, Calusa, Tequesta, and Tocobaga. They will also identify the explorers who came to Florida and examine their motivations for exploration.
