## School Advisory Council & School Advisory Forum Joint Meeting

Wednesday, January 28, at 6:00 pm

  - a. Mr. Kenney called the meeting to order at 6:05 pm

- IV. Principal's Update (*by Mrs. Reid, CCES Principal*)
  - a. Principal Update
    - i. Academic progress is Soaring! Students in Grades KG-6<sup>th</sup> are demonstrating achievement as evidence by standardized testing and iReady. Student motivation is continuous.
      1. We recently had a GLOW PARTY for the students
    - ii. Students here at Coconut Creek K-8, celebrated the 100<sup>th</sup> day of school
      1. Students KG-5<sup>th</sup> received a snack donated from parents and staff
    - iii. Attendance and Tardies have seen a slight increase. Please ensure that your children are present and on time.

    - i. PM2 is done! Students in KG-2<sup>nd</sup> took the STAR assessment, and 3<sup>rd</sup>-6<sup>th</sup> took the FAST assessment.

- IX. North Area Advisory Council Updates
- a. North Region Updates - Overview of PM2 (Progress Monitoring 2) data - due to the active testing window, only aggregate North Region data was shared; school data to be shared once testing concludes. -PM2 data shows a clear upward trajectory compared to prior years. Several schools' PM2 results now match or exceed last year's PM3, indicating positive momentum toward year-end outcomes.
  - b. North Region currently has approximately 7–8 "C" schools, with a stated goal of eliminating all "C" ratings.
  - c. Graduation Highlights - Broward high schools reported the highest graduation rate in Florida, approximately 97.5%, including non-traditional schools. Graduation rate reflects students earning a standard high school diploma, not certificates of attendance.
  - d. Assessment Structure & Accountability - PM assessments measure English Language Arts (ELA) from grades 3–10. PM3 is the assessment tied to graduation requirements in 10th grade. Math PM testing occurs in elementary and middle school; high schools instead use: District benchmarks (BSA) and End-of-Course (EOC) exams (Algebra I, Geometry, Biology, U.S. History)
  - e. Elementary School Practices - PM2 is used as a roadmap for the remainder of the school year. Schools conduct student-by-student data reviews using detailed spreadsheets to ensure no child is overlooked. Interventions include classroom teachers, push-in and pull-out support and ESE, gifted, and enrichment services. Parent

engagement strategies include: printed reports, literacy nights and conferences explaining student data and growth expectations. Accommodations are provided for students with disabilities, including breaks and alternate testing supports. Students, including those in early grades, actively set goals and track their own progress.

f. Graduation Venues - Concerns were raised regarding the district decision to move many high school graduation ceremonies from large external venues to school gymnasiums as a cost-saving measure. The decision generated strong community reaction due to timing and optics, occurring alongside reports of district financial mismanagement, staff overpayments, hiring freezes, and reductions impacting schools. While it was acknowledged that referendum funds cannot legally be used for graduation expenses, participants emphasized that the public perception remains negative and affects trust in the district.

i. Graduation Venue Assignments (North Region)

1. NSU (Nova Southeastern University): JP Taravella High and Coral Glades High
2. Hard Rock Live: Cypress Bay High and Marjory Stoneman Douglas High (Selected due to having the two largest graduating classes and limited venue availability.)
3. Blanche Ely High (host site): Blanche Ely High, Atlantic Technical College, College Academy (North and Central), Dave Thomas Education Center, and Millennium High
4. Dillard High (host site): Coconut Creek High, Coral Springs High, and Deerfield Beach High
5. Pompano Beach High (host site): Pompano Beach High, Northeast High, and Broward Virtual
6. On-campus graduations: Bright Horizons and Cross Creek School
