Joint Meeting**

Wednesday, October 22, 2025, at 6:00 pm

- I. Call to Order
 - a. Mr. Kenney called the meeting to order at 6:05 pm

- II. Attendance (indicate quorum in minutes)
 - a. We have a quorum

- III. Review and approval of minutes from the September 2025 meeting
 - a. Mr. Kenney asked the Council to review the September 2025 minutes
 - i. Alexandra Lindholm made a motion to approve the September 2025 minutes, and Jose Recio seconded it.

- IV. Principal's Update (*by Mrs. Reid, CCES Principal*)
 - a. Principal Update
 - i. We have been monitoring all of our grade levels after the PM 1 was completed.
 - ii. This past weekend, we received a \$2,000 check from Sprouts of Coconut Creek. They gave us the donation for a community garden, for an edible garden. We're going to work on ordering some supplies. Once we get the date in place, we'll reach out to our family to find out who wants to come out to help us with those edible gardens. Our very own Mrs. Walsh, our resident gardener, will help us determine what exactly we will plant. This opportunity will be so wonderful for our students to be able to see the process from seed to actually seeing the fruit and vegetables grown.
 - iii. On November 1st, Coconut Creek K-8 will be receiving recognition from Burlington. We have a brand-new Burlington opening up right across the street in the Publix shopping center. We will be part of their grand opening on Saturday, November 1st.

- iv. We have Trunk or Treat coming up, hosted by our PTA on Friday, October 24th, from 6 pm -8 pm.
- v. On Friday, October 31st, we will have a storybook character parade and/or dance.
- vi. KG-2nd will have an activity called No So Spooky. They will have hands-on activities for math and ELA. In the afternoon, students will have a dance party.
- vii. School Board Member, Nora Rupert, visited Coconut Creek K-8 this week.
- viii. Mr. Alfonso Velasco, our music teacher, has resigned. He moved to a charter school closer to his house in Cooper City. This is a huge loss for us; he was very well-liked by the students and staff. The students had so much fun learning about music and playing music. We are actively trying to hire a new music teacher.
- ix. We received \$50,000 worth of instruments last week for our middle school music program.
- x. The Cambridge Program rolled out with our 6th graders in the Global Perspectives class. We will have additional teachers trained in the coming school year, to find out which aspects of it we will roll out for the 26/27 school year.

b. SIP Monitoring

- i. Does anyone have any questions about data? We were 58%, and you need to be at 62% to get an "A". So, we were a couple of percentage points away, actually.
- ii. All teachers in KG-6th grades recently had something called "Off the Floor Day". That's when they're out of the class, and we talk about data, we talk about strategies for the children. It is basically a professional development day for the teachers. As part of that Professional Development Day, we shared some information, we shared the diversity of our school, and we shared how many students we have. We have a very large ESE population. We have 179. ESE students. The total population of Coconut Creek K-8 is 496 students. We have 73 students in our ASD program.
- iii. If you look at last year's data, we earned 58% of the points. You need a 62% to be an "A", and actually, this year, now that we're in a combination school, we need a 65% to be an "A". The school grade only comes from the intermediate grades, third, fourth, and fifth grades. So our third graders were at 38% a couple of years ago, went up to 49%, and were at 53% last year. So our third graders have been increasing each year, so that gave us a four-point gain. Our lowest students in grades 3rd, 4th, and 5th, are they making the progress that we need them to make? It's called a learning gain. So we're spending a lot of attention on that this year and making sure that the coaches are going in and providing them services and that we're really looking at their data. In Math, it was similar to 3rd grade in terms of three years ago, we are 44%, and we went to 52%, then last year we went up to 62%. We had a 10-point gain over the years before. We had a 7-point gain for learning gains, just lost one point there. So the green that we had here got taken away in the reading. That data showed that compared to the other schools in our cadre, we were towards the top of the list or somewhere in the middle of the schools.

- e. School Accountability Funds
 - i. The past few days have been very crazy regarding the School Accountability Fund. At one point, the funds were taken away from many of the schools in the county, and now the account will be replenished with our amount in the coming weeks.
 - ii. We have \$3,400 in our Accountability Fund.

VIII. Open Discussion

- a. A parent asked, What is going on with the uncut grass around on campus.
 - i. From Mrs. Reid, the district is working on bids with lawn services.
- b. A parent asked about our basketball court always being wet. Is there anything we can do about that?
 - i. Coach Kenney is out on the court early in the morning to prepare the court for the day. Sweeping the court of debris and squeegeeing the court when it is wet. The beginning of the year is the wet season, and hopefully we have better weather rest of the year.
- c. A parent asked when we will be getting a new assistant principal.
 - i. At this time, the school district is on an Administration hiring freeze. Mrs. Reid is receiving check-ins from the district on how we are doing without an assistant principal.

IX. School Advisory Forum Updates – North Area Advisory Council

- a. If you ever want to get a lot of information about the school district and or North Area schools, come to this meeting. The meeting starts at 6:15 pm on the 3rd Thursday of each month.
- b. The district is testing new vape detectors in several high schools. Various systems are being tested at different schools, with different vendors, and different systems with

different capabilities. There were discussions about using AI on some of the sensors so that the sensors can differentiate between vape smoke and smoke.

- i. But the problem is that the smoke detectors will still sense the smoke, so the fire alarm will go off. And the fire trucks will still come. District cannot share trial data since they don't want to compromise on research and procedure or procurements. AI technology can differentiate between vape smoke, traditional cigarettes, and drug
- c. The district is pushing the BCPSCares website.
 - i. If you have a problem or concern, the new site is a part of the customer service initiative.
 - ii. From the site, you can also register your child from home into a new school. BCPS is trying to make it easier for you, the parents. They had 1,200 inquiries from December 2024 to June 2025, six months. They've had 1,300 inquiries from July this past July to September 25 in three months.
- d. SAC Funding
 - i. BCPS schools had rollover SIP funds removed immediately
 - ii. The county took the funds because it believed the money should be spent in the current year
 - iii. A+ funds will not roll over at the end of the school year (FY25)
 1. The question remains if A+ funds earned and distributed in Spring 26 will also be taken if not fully spent
 - iv. Accountability funds haven't been funded since 2021 (implication was that ???) didn't realize funds hadn't been distributed)
 - v. SIP/Accountability funds have been funded from discretionary lottery funds, and the governor discontinued that process
 - vi. Classwallet is going to accountability funds – that will be removed as well
- e. A motion was made for District return accountability funds and SIP rollover dollars that schools had left over from previous school year(s) to the school it came from, and they were afforded 120 school days or until the end of the school year, whichever is longer, to vote on spending the funds.
- f. Hazel Health
 - i. Closed down, no longer in the district
