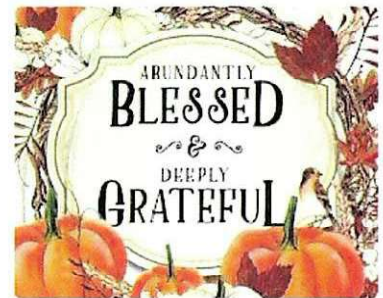

A Word From Principal Haynes

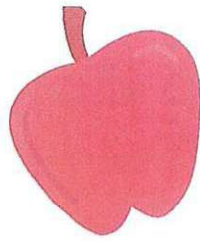
Dear Village Family,

As we get ready to wrap up November and some of our formative assessments, I want you to reflect on your results. Do your scores reflect what you have taught students and when you met with them in small groups? When you met in small group, did the students get it? Did you feel they had a grasp on the material? Now, I want you to think about the testing ENVIRONMENT. What were the conditions like for students? Did you test ALL of your students at once? Even your ELL and ESE students? Students with behavior and attention issues? Did everyone test the same? If you answer yes, you may need to rethink your testing processes. If you are unsure what adjustments you are allowed to make, email me. Let's sit and discuss this BEFORE the PM2 test administration!! You want to get the BEST results from your students, so you have to think about HOW you can do that. Some simple tweaks may be what is needed to take your student results from good to great or from mediocre to good or great! It's a SERIOUS conversation to have.

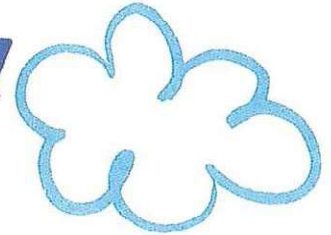


You have to make sure your testing expectations are clear with students. The need to understand HOW to test and WHY you are asking them to do what they do. I have had conversations with students about material and I know they understand. We have to get to the root of what is getting in the way of their applying that understanding.

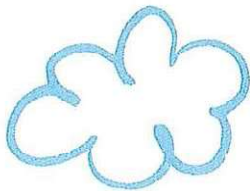

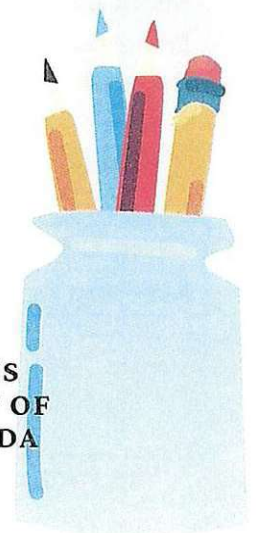
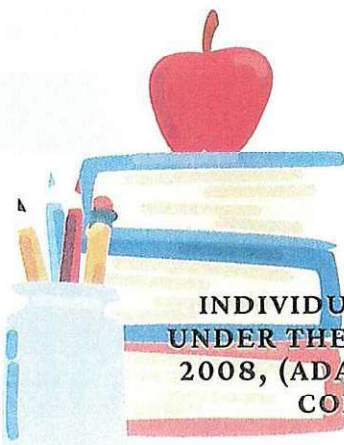

Approval of SAC Meeting Minutes-October 28, 2025	SAC minutes for the month of October were presented and were accepted as presented. A motion was made by Ms. A. Francis to accept the minutes as read and seconded by Ms. Robbins.

New Business									
Chief Daniel Ransome Sunrise Police Department	Chief Daniel Ransome, informed parents that he was visiting the PTAs and/or SAC meeting of all the schools in the city of Sunrise. The purpose of his visit was to talk about the installation of speed enforcement cameras in school zones in the city. Drivers are expected to observe the school zone speed limit, which is 15 mph when flashing or the posted speed limit during all other times. Active times for speed enforcement cameras will be during all school days starting 30 minutes before school begins and lasting until 30 minutes after the end of the school day. In the first 30 days, the city will issue a warning, and after that the tickets will potentially be \$100 per citation.								
Ms. Helen King Media Specialist-Data Collection Plan	Ms. King shared information regarding the library books. She talked about updating the books in the library using funds from sources such as the Scholastic Book Fair. She also informed parents that there is an option to opt out of checking books out of the library.								
Principal's Update	The railings on the 900 building are being replaced for safety reasons. Safety rails have been installed as well as fences around heavy equipment.

School Recognition Fund-Ballot Creation

Funds were given to schools based on the school's performance during the 24-25 school year.

Ms. Haynes shared that attaining a B makes Village eligible for the funds.

- The process must be completed February 1, 2026
- Steps to guide the creation of the ballot were discussed
- Reviewed the award
- Reviewed which staff members are eligible to receive the funds
- What should be included on the ballot

She disclosed that the funds that are being voted for this year are \$50,229.

The chair brought to the council that a ballot needs to be created for staff to determine how to spend the funds. Discussion ensued, and the ballot was created with three different options.

The options presented were:

OPTION #1

70% of the funds will go to instructional staff and administration on the 2024-2025 roster. Staff must have worked at least 100 school days of the 2024-25 school year.

24% of the funds will go to non-instructional staff on the 2024-2025 roster. Staff must have worked at least 100 school days of the 2024-25 school year.

3% of the funds will go to non-organizational unit staff (campus monitor/cafeteria) staff. Must have worked at least 100 school days of the 2024-25 school year.

3% of the funds will go to the school for nonrecurring expenditures for educational materials: ELO camp supplemental materials for grades 3-5.

Any leftover School Recognition Funds Program funds should be used for nonrecurring expenditures for educational equipment and materials.

OPTION #2

70% of the funds will go to instructional staff and administration on the 2024-2025 roster. Staff must have worked at least 100 school days of the 2024-25 school year.

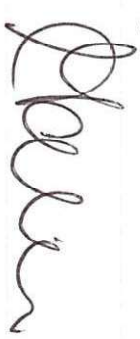

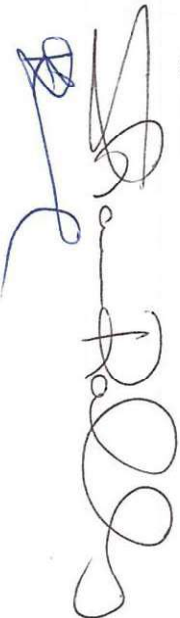

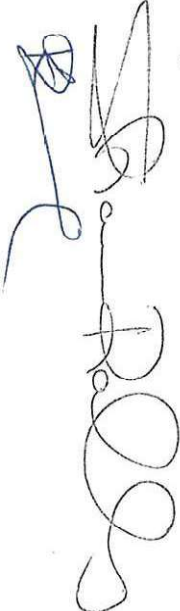

Good Afternoon Teachers and Staff,

During the November SAC Meeting, a ballot for how to spend School Recognition Funds was created and voted on by the SAC Composition. The ballot contained 3 options that were approved by the SAC composition after discussion with both staff and parents who were in attendance.

A previous staff vote was taken on December 5, 2025; however, the ballot used for the voting was not in alignment with what the SAC Composition agreed to. As such, a new vote must be taken using the correct ballot according to the SAC Meeting minutes.

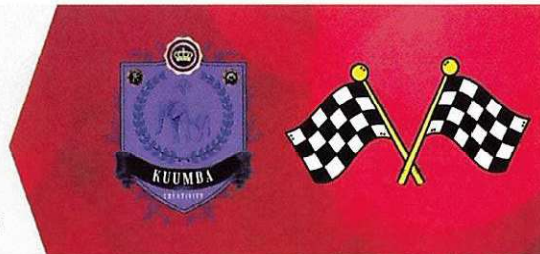
A sample ballot with all three options is ***being placed in the mail room, the front office, and in the teacher's lounge*** so that you can view the options at your earliest convenience. I am also attaching the sample ballot to this email. **We will have a staff vote on Tuesday, January 20, 2026. Voting time will be 7:30AM to 8:00AM and 2:30PM to 3:00PM in the Media Center.** An option must gain at least 51% of the staff's vote to be approved by the school. Only school staff who are on the school's payroll may vote. The process must be completed by February 1, 2026. ***If at that time we have not come to a consensus, the amount will be divided amongst current classroom teachers only.***

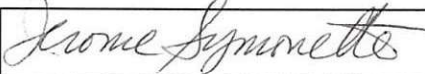
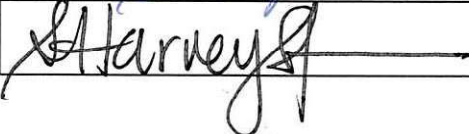
