SAC Minutes - March 25, 2026

Call to Order: Meeting was called to order by Ms. Philippe at 5:14pm. and attendance was taken at the meeting.

New Business:

- Ms. Philippe welcomed and began the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance and introduces the agenda for the month of March.

School Updates

- Ms. Philippe began by announcing that the fourth academic quarter has officially commenced at C Robert Markham Elementary. The school is actively making preparations for the upcoming PM3 math and PM3 reading assessments, which are scheduled to take place in May.
- **PM3 Testing Dates**
 - The testing window for PM3 Math and PM3 Reading has been officially set. Assessments will be administered from April 27 through May 29. During this period, all students are expected to participate in both subject areas.
- **Achievement Goals**
 - The primary objective for students taking the PM3 assessments is to attain scores of three, four, or five. Achieving these scores will reflect strong performance and mastery of the required content in both math and reading.
- Third-quarter report cards will be distributed to parents on Friday, with hard copies and access available on the Focus portal.
- **Upcoming Career Day Event at Markham**
 - An upcoming Career Day event is scheduled for April 2, with math night set for April 1 at 6 PM.
 - April 3 is Good Friday, and there will be no school, while April 6 is a teacher planning day with no school for students but school for teachers and staff.
 - The third quarter Honor Roll assembly dates (K-2) April 8, 2026), and 3 – 5 April 9, 2026).
 - Fourth-quarter interim reports will be issued on April 28, and Miss Allen will provide updates on accountability proposals
- Ms. Philippe introduced Miss Allen to present information for the Accountability Funds.

Proposal for Accountability Funds presented by Ms. Junoisier Allen

- A proposal for instructional materials was presented, taking into account the financial challenges currently faced by the district. These budget constraints have impacted on the ability to allocate sufficient resources for new or updated instructional materials.
- Budget Consideration
 - The district-wide financial difficulties have necessitated careful prioritization and evaluation of the instructional materials proposal. As a result, any decisions regarding the acquisition or implementation of new materials must be made with strict attention to the available budget.
- **Proposal Expenditures**
- **Instructional Materials** – includes requests for iReady Reading Teacher Toolbox for Grade Levels KG – 5th. Cost \$3,700.
- **Instructional Materials** – Acaletics Math. Cost: \$4,000.
 - Funds are requested for Acaletics Math instructional materials to support mathematics instruction, intervention and extended learning opportunities for the math club
- **Extended Learning Opportunities (ELO)** – Acaletics Math Club Stipends. Total Cost: \$1,000.
- **Stipend Allocation:** Three (3) stipends at \$333.00 each.
 - Facilitators: Mr. Ronnie Frazier, Ms. Veronica Jackson and Ms. Sherronne Mcintosh
- **Student Headphones**
- **Cost: \$2,524.30** (To be purchased using remaining Accountability Funds).
 - A request for student headphones is also made, with a budget of \$2500 proposed to purchase 300 sets. Funds are requested for the purchase of student headphones to support instructional technology use, online assessments, intervention programs, and digital learning platforms.
- **Summary of Requested Funds**
 - iReady Reading Teacher Toolbox - \$3,700
 - Acaletics Math instructional Materials - \$4,000
 - ELO Acaletics Math Club Stipends - \$1,000
 - Student Headphones - \$2,524.30
- The total cost of the proposed materials is \$11,224, which would deplete the entire accountability fund.
- **Clarification on Budget and Voting Procedures**
 - Ms. Allen addressed the processes associated with the budget, specifying the steps to ensure clarity and proper management.

- Clarification was provided on the budget closing date, which is the 15th, with a need for updated quotes and processing time.
 - Voting by quorum members was reviewed and all SAC committee members were not present; an emergency meeting will be called.
 - The impact of budget constraints on instructional materials and school improvement plans is emphasized.
 - The importance of making conscious decisions about spending and prioritizing funds was highlighted.
- **Updates on After-School Programs and Events**
 - After-school tutoring started on March 17, with the Athletics Math Club starting on March 7.
 - A second-grade field trip to Miracle Ranch took place on March 10, and Muffins for Moms and Donuts for Dads events are scheduled.
 - Math Family Night April 1st
 - Career Day – April 2nd
 - Science Family Night - April 16th
 - Take a Child to Work Day – April 25th
 - STAR/FAST PM3 Testing KG – 5th – April 27th
 - The importance of staff participation in events and meetings is reiterated, with plans to involve more staff in future activities.
 - **Construction Update**
 - Ms. Allen added that Building 1 demolition has been completed, and repairs are being made to Building 2.
 - **Sessir Updates**
 - Mr. Frazier presented the Sessir updates starting out with Bullying and Harassment Trends.
 - Mr. Frazier noted that there was an increase in incidents stemming from social media and text messages.
 - The guidance counselor is meeting with affected students, and parents are being made aware of the issue.
 - Mr. Frazier further noted the importance of monitoring social media accounts and having conversations with students about responsible use is emphasized.
 - A proposal for a bullying assembly to raise awareness and provide interactive scenarios was discussed.
 - **PTA Fundraising and Future Plans**
 - The PTA had a successful fundraiser, raising around \$400, with plans to incorporate more frequent fundraising activities.
 - Discussion about setting up fundraising events during early release days and after school are ongoing.

- The need for consistent participation from retired ladies and other volunteers is highlighted.
- Plans to improve the quality and consistency of ice and popcorn for fundraising events are discussed.

Questions/Discussion:

- **Discussion on Staff Attendance and Meeting Participation initiated by Ms. Allen.**
 - There was a discussion about the attendance of staff members at meetings, with concerns about consistent participation.
 - The need for active and involved members is emphasized, with a proposal to vote for new members in the next meeting.
 - The importance of making meetings pertinent and ensuring staff attendance is highlighted
- Ms. Philippe adjourned the meeting.

School Advisory Council (SAC) Funding Proposal

C. Robert Markham Elementary School

Funding Source: School Accountability Funds

Purpose: To support implementation of the School Improvement Plan (SIP) through one-time expenditures that directly impact student achievement.

Proposed Expenditures

1. Instructional Materials – i-Ready Reading Teacher Toolbox

Grade Levels: KG – 5th

Cost: \$3,700.00

Funds are requested for the purchase of the i-Ready Reading Teacher Toolbox to support targeted literacy instruction aligned to student diagnostic data. The Teacher Toolbox provides standards-aligned lessons, scaffolded resources, and intervention supports that will be used during core instruction and small-group intervention to address identified reading skill deficits. This is a one-time instructional materials purchase directly aligned to SIP literacy goals focused on increasing student proficiency.

2. Instructional Materials – Acaletics Math

Cost: \$4,000.00

Funds are requested for Acaletics Math instructional materials to support mathematics instruction and intervention. These resources provide structured problem-solving and reasoning activities aligned to state standards and SIP math goals. Materials will be used during core instruction and small-group intervention to increase student proficiency in mathematics, particularly for students in Grades 4 and 5. This is a one-time allowable instructional materials purchase.

3. Extended Learning Opportunities (ELO) – Acaletics Math Club Stipends

Total Cost: \$1,000.00

Stipend Allocation: Three (3) stipends at **\$333.00** each

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Funds are requested to provide stipends for staff facilitating the Acaletics Math Club as an Extended Learning Opportunity during the school day for 4th and 5th grade students. This targeted instructional support provides additional math enrichment and intervention designed to increase student proficiency and address identified achievement gaps. Stipends are limited, one-time expenditures directly tied to instructional services and SIP action steps.

4. Student Headphones

Cost: \$2,524.30

(To be purchased using remaining Accountability Funds)

Funds are requested for the purchase of student headphones to support instructional technology use, online assessments, intervention programs, and digital learning platforms. This purchase ensures equitable access to instructional resources, supports assessment requirements, and improves the instructional environment by reducing distractions. This is a one-time equipment purchase allowable under Accountability Funds.



