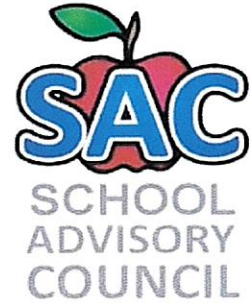

SAC Minutes - 02/23/2026

Attendance: 9 SAC members and Guests

Call to Order:

A meeting of the Deerfield Beach High School Advisory Council was held in the School's Media Center on Feb. 23, 2026

Chair Mr. Kelan Williams called the meeting to order at 3:01 PM. Nelsie Rivera will record minutes for this meeting.

Agenda:

A. Staple Agenda Items

- SIP Monitoring
 - Mr. Williams reported that the committee reviewed the most recent data reflecting progress toward the School Improvement Plan (SIP) goals. He noted measurable growth in both PM1 and PM2 indicators. The data referenced was collected during the previous meeting as we await the facilitation of the next round of assessments to end Quarter 3.
- Stakeholder Feedback
 - No significant stakeholder feedback was presented at this time.
- SESIR Reporting
 - Mr. Williams provided an update on student behavior trends based on current referral data. He explained that while a process is in place to address student tardiness, the number of tardies continues to rise. Due to delays in implementing consequences, an adjustment has been made: students will now be held in RISE on their fifth tardy. Mr. Williams emphasized that this change is intended to balance the need for consistent discipline with the importance of maximizing instructional time.

B. Special Report

- Principal's Report
 - Mr. Marlow reported the successful facilitation of the Holocaust educational activity held earlier today, noting its effectiveness in presenting historical context and engaging students meaningfully. He also highlighted the success of the staff luncheon held in recognition of Black History Month.

- He shared that the school has achieved a 97% graduation rate, reflecting a 5% increase from the previous year. Additionally, the school is currently at an 83% acceleration rate.
- Ms. Deese provided an update on the Jazz band assessment, reporting that ten students participated and represented the school in the county-level competition, as they received all superior ratings.

C. Accountability Report

- Mr. Williams reported an accountability balance of \$26,039.62 as of February 5, 2026.
- Mr. Marlow explained that these funds may be accessed by various departments to support departmental activities, staff development initiatives, and the purchase of laboratory tools and equipment that enhance the teaching and learning process.

D. PSAT Funding Request

- Ms. Ghersie and Mr. J. Smith requested \$3,000 in funding to support PSAT testing for students in need of testing requirement.
- Ms. Ali made a motion to approve the funding request
- Ms. Gordon provided the second motion.
- Motion carried unanimously.

E. Announcement

- Youth Programs
 - Youth Programs. Ms. Deroseney shared several upcoming student activities designed to promote engagement and school spirit.
 - Mr. Joel Smith announced that Family Fun Day will take place on April 11 at Techno Park.
 - Mr. Marlow also noted that \$109,000 has been allocated for the purchase of new band equipment.
