6:15 pm Mr. Soto read the meeting minutes.

- Mr. Soto addressed the group to ask for any corrections.
- Mrs. Killinger made a motion to approve the minutes.

6:20pm Mrs. Killinger introduced Mr. Griffin to give the principal report

- Mr. Griffin described the i-ready procedure.
- He described for parents how to check for i-ready improvement and how i-ready scores can be read.
- Explained the correlation between i-ready scores and PSAT
- PM1 18% students scored proficient
- After interventions
- PM2 30% of students scored proficient
- Mr. Griffin stressed the importance of using i-ready at home.
- Partnership with Hockey League

- Transportation will be provided to the event from the school

6:45 pm Mrs. Killinger Introduced David Simpsons from FAU Promise Neighborhood

- Parents and community members were sent a flyer earlier in the week
- Mr. Simpson described the information contained in the document
- The program's goal is to provide support to students from early childhood all the way to 12th grade.
- A neighborhood survey was handed out to the group.
- Survey data will be presented back to the community during a future meeting
- Mr. Simpson ended his presentation by providing an opportunity for the group to ask if there were any questions.

6:50 pm Mrs. Killinger provided an introduction to the A plus funds

- 170,225.00 award amount
- She explained that we must decide how the money is dispersed

- SAC will vote on a ballot that the group creates
- The rules for the ballot creation were reviewed with the group.
- Mrs. Killinger presented last year's ballots
- A committee was set up this year to work student incentives
- Carloyn made a proposal to keep last year's ballot
- Mrs. Killinger re-read the ballots from last year
- *Proposal for the 24–25 At Funds*
- This proposal recommends that district employees who are primarily based at Boyd Anderson be included in the 2024–2025 At funds allocation. These staff members provide consistent, direct support to the school's students, faculty, and overall instructional environment, contributing meaningfully to student achievement and school operations.
- Including district based staff in the At funds distribution recognizes their ongoing contributions, promotes equity among staff serving the Boyd Anderson community, and supports morale and retention.
- Therefore, it is recommended that district workers assigned to Boyd Anderson be eligible for participation in the 2024–2025 At funds distribution.
- Paper was handed out for proposals

7:24- Proposals were discussed. Mr. Griffin described the extra period process.

- Mr. Griffin emphasized the importance of clear communication and proper reporting channels when concerns arise involving instructional staff or assistant principals.
- Members were reminded that grievances must follow contractual procedures and be directed to the appropriate individual, not bypassed.
- It was noted that administrators cannot address issues they are not informed about.
- Concerns were raised that problems are sometimes discussed informally among staff without being escalated through official channels, limiting the ability to resolve them

7:40 Parent as a question.

- A parent asked about budget line items, specifically regarding the use and reallocation of allocated funds.
- Response
- It was explained by Mr. Griffin that budget lines cannot be altered without district-level approval.
- All expenditures must be documented, calculated, and justified according to district requirements.
- Funds not used must still be accounted for, and any reallocation requires formal approval.
- Budget decisions are highly regulated and require oversight beyond the school level.

7:50pm Student Experience and School Culture

- Parent Comment
- A parent shared a positive personal experience, stating that:
 - Their decision to enroll their child at the school was influenced by positive interactions with counseling staff.
 - The school's environment and student support contributed to confidence in the school's mission.
- Committee Discussion

- Members agreed that student experience is a critical factor in enrollment, retention, and community perception.
- Positive experiences help attract families and maintain trust..

7:55pm Mrs. Killinger referred to the proposals ballots to ask if any more proposals needed to be added.
