1. Welcome and Introductions – called to order at 7:38am
2. Attendance – everyone please remember to sign-in
3. Review and Approve January's Minutes – motion to approve by Mr. Gorde and seconded by Ms. Gimenez. All approved.
4. School Improvement Plan Update – administration is continuously monitoring and updating plan; the mid-year review was completed; both school goals are related to English/Language Arts and have been reviewed by administration and we are currently on track per Ms. Gibbons (the AP over the Language Arts department); ELO's will begin with small group instruction; students are selected based on their weaknesses
5. Accreditation - continue to be a fully accredited district
6. SAC Funds-Current Balance-\$5,920.04; funds were voted on and used towards ELO's to prepare for PM3
7. Vote to Use Remaining Accountability Funds on Extended Learning Opportunities for students; money will be taken by district if not used by the end of the school year; Ms. Gonzales requests to use the remaining funds towards the student agendas (\$1, 969.00); additional funds (\$3509) have been requested for additional ELO's to address the needs of students in the lowest quartile in Math and Language Arts as well as bubble students in the areas of Civics and Science; 2 Saturdays will also be included in the ELO; the remaining funds (\$354.18) will be used towards school supplies for all teachers for next year; Ms. Gimenez moves to use all requested funds for motion as it stands, seconded by Ms. Valenzuela; balance will be \$0.00
8. School Environmental Safety Incident Reporting (SESIR) Data: through January 2026; drug possession due to students vaping; Ms. Gonzalez has asked parents to discuss the risks of vaping with their students; vape detectors have yet to be installed due to an issue with bids at the district level; one weapon possession was due to a grooming tool that was inserted in a comb

10. Principal's Report – The second instructional review recently took place. Approximately 15-20 district leaders toured the school. The community garage sale is taking place on Saturday 3/1, the community has been invited to rent spots and set up tables to sell their goods. In conclusion to a series of activities this month, a Black History celebration/assembly is taking place in school today 2/25, and includes the Dillard and South Plantation High School Bands. School tours take place almost every day. The fire alarm testing continues almost daily after 3:00pm and we are in the final phase of this process. A parent mentioned her concerns with a bullying incident that was recorded on her student's phone; district procedures were followed. Ms. Gonzalez will follow up with the parent personally. A parent asked what will happen to supporting the students next year since we are using all of the accountability funds; we are hoping that the Class

Wallet funds will help replenish some of the funds; once we have our budget meetings we will also see how we can use the money and still support our students. It was also asked about the number of reassignments we will have based on the combination of Plantation Middle and Plantation High. Our reassignments are based on actual building capacity. Once seats are full based on the building capacity, our reassignments will go on a waiting list. Plantation Middle will not be rezoned for Seminole due to the combination of the two schools; we will just get new students from reassignments. We opened most of our seats in the 6th grade. We do anticipate meeting our student capacity. We currently have about 10 students over our projection for this school year. In District 6 (our school board district) we are all enrolled at our projected numbers, but they will be discussing more redefining meetings for next year. Mr. Gorde has been working with Jorge Soler and his public relations team and hoping to have them invest in our schools. They request to have 4 schools together to support.
