1) Welcome, Verification, and Housekeeping

- Called to Order by: Mr. Clark, SAC Chair (Time: 6:05pm)- welcomed attendees and thanked participants.
- Sign-In/QR Code: Reminder to scan and submit information (required for SAC voting eligibility).
- Clarification:
 - SAF (School Advisory Forum): open forum; any parent may vote.
 - SAC (School Advisory Council): agenda-driven; only elected SAC members vote; all may attend and discuss.

2) Introductions

4) Bylaws — Review & Ratification

- Highlights (as summarized):
 - SAC objective: identify needs; recommend actions; foster a positive learning environment.
 - SIP (School Improvement Plan): SAC facilitates development, monitors implementation, evaluates effectiveness, advises on budget alignment to support SIP.
 - Representative Membership required (parents, staff, students, community, etc.).
 - Designated Parent Reps Needed: ESE, ESOL/ELL, Gifted.
 - ESE Parent: Beatrice Baptiste, Cheri Cummings.
 - ESOL/ELL Parent: Needed (to be recruited/appointed).
 - Gifted Parent: Anisha Hartman.
 - Election
 - I-zone Representative:
 - SAC Chair and BTU Steward are ex officio members of SAC (as applicable).
 - Officers elected annually at September meeting; one-year terms; installation at first meeting of year.
- Motion: Ratify/adopt SAC bylaws for the year.
 - Moved by: Von Howard Second: Rebecca Smith
 - Vote: Passed (Aye) — Motion carries.

5) Officer Elections

- Nominations:
 - Chair: Mr. Clark — nominated and elected
 - Secretary: Ms. Cummings →nominated and Elected
- Votes: Ayes recorded; no opposition noted.

6) Approval of Previous Minutes

- Prior Meeting: May 2025 SAC Minutes
- Members reviewed for edits.
- Motion: Approve minutes with any necessary corrections.
 - Moved by: Rebecca Smith Second: Cheri Cummings
 - Vote: Passed (Aye); no nays — Motion carries.

7) Safety & Security Update (HB 1473 | Gates, Traffic, Walkers)

- Reporting Options: See Something, Say Something and Alyssa’s Alert; anonymous reporting via FortifyFL app.
- HB 1473 (State Statute) Summary:
 - Campuses must be locked immediately after dismissal.
 - Exceptions require staffed gates (campus employee/security).
 - East Gate remains open until ~5:30 PM; other gates locked; rear/back gate secured.
- Campus Security Notes (Mr. Peterson, Security Manager):
 - “Exclusive zone” (inside) secured; “non-exclusive zone” (parking lots/community school) has different constraints.
 - On game nights, Stuart Gate is open and staffed; otherwise 3:00 PM lock standard applies.
- Meeting-Night Parking:
 - Student lot open only when staffed (e.g., for games).
 - For SAC nights, use East Gate; staff will try to cover until roughly 6:00–6:10 PM.
 - Encourage phone-number sharing for late arrival access.
 - Signage ordered for point-of-entry gate: “Students are not allowed to open this gate; camera monitored.”
- Morning Operations:
 - Gate opens ~7:00–7:10 AM; students enter at 7:10 (requires supervision in place).
 - Gate closes at 7:40 AM; late students use East Gate and sign in.
 - Walkers must enter through East Gate (and not through the student lot).
 - Parent/community feedback flagged pedestrian/cars bottleneck risk at student lot gate.
- Action Items:
 - Cease walker entry through student lot effective immediately. Owner: Security Manager.
 - Evaluate sidewalk traffic control options, report back next meeting. Owner: Security Team.
 - Confirm enforcement of 7:40 AM close time, address staffing gaps. Owner: Security Manager.
 - Install point-of-entry signage when delivered. Owner: Administration.
 - Communicate designated gates & metal detector pathway expectations to families. Owner: Admin/Communications.

- Scope Reminder: Chair clarified that traffic/gate deep-dive is more appropriate in SAF; SAC remains agenda-bound.

8) Principal's Report

- Opening of School: "Smoothest opening in 7 years"; students attentive and acclimated quickly.
- Enrollment: 9th grade projected 450; actual ~514 (+64). Balancing larger 9th-grade classes.
- Tardy/Attendance Program ("Hero"):
 - Begins tomorrow; parent link sent; announcements ongoing.
 - Morning grace to 7:50 AM due to potential traffic line at 7:40 bell.
 - 6-minute class transitions; warning bell at 2 minutes; escalating consequences for repeated tardies.
 - Emphasis on bell-to-bell instruction and clear hallways (safety & learning time).
- Recent/Upcoming Events:
 - Open House — strong turnout; ESE Open House followed two days later.
 - Homecoming:
 - Game: Sept 26 vs Coral Springs HS (Bengals Stadium)
 - Dance: Sept 27 (Gym; campus-based for safety & cost control) — Tickets \$45 (includes dinner; DJ/music).
 - Interims: in two weeks; Quarter ends second week of October.
 - Professional Study Day: Thu, Sept 4 — early dismissal 11:40 AM; PD in afternoon (also occurs in Nov/Feb/Apr).
- Athletics: Volleyball performing strongly; first home football game Sept 26.
- Campus Trend: Vaping remains a serious issue; zero-tolerance consequences; encourage parent conversations.
- Commendations: Appreciation for students' positivity; campus culture strong.

9) Accountability Funds & Budget Updates

- Carryover: ~\$3,000 from prior year.
- A+ Funds Returned/Donated by Teachers: ~\$12,000–\$13,000 (separate account; SAC discretion).
- State Accountability Allocation: Pending (typically ~\$9,000).
- District Budget/Enrollment: School is ahead of budget; expects additional district funds (timeline: next few weeks).
- BEST Tutoring (After School):
 - Target start: 2–3 weeks (dependent on budgets).
 - Days/Times: Tue & Wed, 2:45–4:45 PM.
 - Subjects: Algebra, Geometry, Advanced Math, Biology, Chemistry, English/Reading.
 - Staffing: Teacher-led (paid), Mr. Clark oversees; location: The Nook.

10) Cambridge Program Update

- CEO of Cambridge (UK) Visit: Sept 29 — tours classes; meets students/teachers; admin debrief with Ms. Sterling, Mr. Kothe, Principal.
- Program Scale: 1,500+ tests administered last year; recognized feeder-pattern work in the Zone; model for possible wider rollout.
- Staffing: Ms. Sterling (Cambridge Coordinator) in LEAD program (path to AP); serving as administrative designee this year (due to AP retirement).

11) School Improvement Plan (SIP) — Process for the Year

- Presenter: Ms. Sterling
- Components: Early warning systems; K–12 Comprehensive Reading Plan; PLCs; MTSS; Collaborative Problem-Solving; SEL; etc.
- Plan: Cover 1–2 SIP items in depth at each SAC meeting (beginning next meeting).
