    - 1. Proposal and Ballot Creation- The proposed ballot replicates the 2022-2023 Florida School Recognition Program (A+) Funds ballot.

The Two Proposals are as follows:

Option 1: I agree with distributing 100% of the A+ Recognition monies equally among all full-time staff & faculty members (clerical, custodian, instructional, administration, school counselors, family counselor, school social workers, paraprofessionals, security, and armed guardians) who were employed at Cooper City High School. # E. School Improvement Plan Curricular Update: Science- K. Agnew, Science Department Chair

- 1. We recognize the Biology EOC and its literacy component are key factors contributing to our school's overall performance score. This reflects our school-wide focus on enhancing both scientific understanding and literacy skills.
- 2. Science impacts different areas.
  - a. Science plays a vital role in enhancing reading and math skills, mainly through vocabulary development. The Biology EOC and its literacy component significantly contribute to the school's overall performance score. The 2024 Biology EOC proficiency goal is to improve from 70% to 73%.
  - b. The Biology team is dedicated and collaborates regularly, using common formative assessments and unit tests to analyze data and guide instruction. Teachers also offer after-school tutoring, and extended learning opportunities will be available in the Spring.
  - c. The Biology EOC is divided into three main categories, the largest being Organisms, Populations, and Ecosystems. Currently, students are focusing on Molecular and Cellular Biology, which accounts for 35% of the assessment. While 70% of students score at a level three or higher, the pool of students is shrinking as Pioneer Middle School assesses more students each year. Additionally, AP and AICE courses in Science contribute to school improvement through acceleration points.
  - a. 9th-grade students who are in Environmental Science are taking a Duck Unlimited Certification. This certification is in conservation management, market ecology conservation, and management.
  - b. We are proud of the students' accomplishments and looking for continual improvement.

# F. State and District Assessment Updates- M. Megna, Testing Coordinator

- 1. This presentation is to inform how the school grade is calculated.
- Graduation Requirements are that all scholars earn a three on the 10th Grade FAST Reading and a three on the Algebra 1 EOC. Scholars are provided with opportunities to achieve these goals through alternative tests.

- 3. Testing began in Florida with the FCAT. It has evolved to the FAST testing given now.
- 4. The purpose of state testing is to measure student achievement, hold schools accountable, and provide school grades.
- 5. The Blueprint for FAST testing is that the test is adaptive to the scholar.
- 6. Parents and/or Guardians can access student results on the FAST through FOCUS.
- 7. Students who need accommodations for the PSAT/SAT must apply directly to the College Board to receive those accommodations.
- 8. MAP testing for Reading is new this year and is administered three times a year.
- 9. Teachers are provided with professional development to conduct the appropriate testing environment. Test security is a priority. Students are not allowed to access their phones, smart watches, or AirPods.
- 10. Tests are invalidated for breach of security. For national and international exams, phones are confiscated, and photos are reviewed for confidential images of the exams. College Board can deny future testing on SAT/ACT for scholars caught breaching security. Cambridge may have more severe consequences.
- 11. The opportunities provided for the scholars who have not made concordance are FAST PM 1, FAST PM 2, FAST PM 3, Summer Retake, SAT, PSAT, and the CLT. Seniors are allowed to take the Florida Civics Literacy Exam which is needed in their first year of college.

  - a. Ms. Perkovic thanked everyone for all the work that they do. We truly work somewhere special and shared the following recognitions.
  - b. CCHS was recognized as a School of Excellence. CCHS earned this distinction by scoring in the 80th percentile or higher in the grade calculation compared to schools in the same grade group for at least two of the past three school years.
  - c. Ms. Gailboord (teacher) was awarded Outstanding Holocaust Teacher for BCPS. This award recognizes educators who have significantly impacted their schools and communities in the fields of Holocaust, genocide, and human rights education.
  - d. CCHS was recognized as an AP Honor Roll School with Access by College Board. The AP School Honor Roll recognizes U.S. and Canadian schools for excellence in advanced coursework access and performance, with four distinction levels: Bronze, Silver, Gold, and Platinum
  - e. Fall sports have wrapped up. Swimming and Track went to district competition. Winter Sports have begun.
  - f. Ms. Perkovic thanked Ms. Hicks, faculty, staff, and scholar for all their effort with Harvest Drive. As a school community, we collect seven pallets of items.
  - g. Ms. Dominguez shared that the peer counseling team is visiting classrooms and working on an Anti-Bullying curriculum. We are Kind, Cowboys. CCHS has a Silver Night Nominees for each category this year.
  - h. On December 4<sup>th,</sup> 9th and 10th grades will take FAST PM 2. The 11th grade will review for their History EOC, and the 12<sup>th</sup> grade will take the FCLE.
  - i. December 5<sup>th</sup> will be Parent University by College Board and PSAT.
  - j. Interim Reports and Report Cards can be found on FOCUS.
  - k. Congratulations to all 1<sup>st</sup> quarter honor scholars.

- 1. Ms. Perkovic expressed the importance of students coming to school on time. When late students miss instructional time. Students walking in late to class disrupt the learning environment. This is unfair to the teachers and the other students. The campus is open to all students at 7:00 am, and breakfast is complimentary. Students should be in there by 7:38 am.






