- I. Welcome/Call to Order/Pledge of Allegiance T. Daub, Behavioral Specialist
  - Meeting was called to order at 3:10 p.m.
- II. Discussion Parameters- Robert's Rules of Order- T. Daub, Behavioral Specialist
  - Robert's Rules of Order were discussed to provide expectations on how the meeting will be conducted
- III. Approval of Minutes T. Daub
  - A motion was made by S. Rausseo to approve the February minutes. The motion was seconded by E. Hoy. All in favor, none opposed. The February minutes were approved.

#### IV. Unfinished Business

- a. School Recognition Funds Balance- \$33,062
- b. Budget Request Update-
  - After contacting the district, it was confirmed that the requested funds cannot be used for the auditorium sound system. All available funds must align with the school's School Improvement Plan goals. The request must be added as a goal in next year's SIP to use the funds for the sound system. Once included, the necessary paperwork can be submitted to route the funds appropriately.

#### V. New Business

- a. Accountability Funds: \$25,762.42
  - Budget Request: CLT Administration for Seniors not meeting concordant scores for graduation- M. Megna, Testing Coordinator-request up to \$1000 for CLT testing for seniors who have not met concordance. The CLT (Classical Learning Test) is a graduation concordance option. It will be offered on April 10th, under a district contract, specifically for seniors who have not yet met graduation requirements. The CLT has a classical literature focus, and students may prefer it depending on their strengths and test structure preference.

- L. Hoy made a motion to approve the budget request. L. Mallozi seconded the motion. All in favor, none opposed. The budget request was approved.
- A question was raised about the amount of funds available in the budget. Various initiatives (e.g., Edmentum, agendas, etc.) have already been approved, and the question asked is where this deduction is reflected. Ms. Daub explained that several previously approved expenses were either unused or partially used.
- **b.** School Improvement Plan Monitoring for 2025-2026
  - Math H. Malan, Math Department Chair
  - In 2024, 69% of students were proficient in Algebra EOC; the goal is to increase that to 71% this year and ultimately to 75%.
  - Teachers meet every Tuesday at 7:35 a.m. to review data, discuss assessments, and coordinate planning. Common planning is emphasized, with some meetings occurring during lunch or after school.
  - Teachers use common formative assessments to guide instruction and measure effectiveness. An emphasis is placed on high expectations, progress monitoring, content alignment, and supplemental support
  - Math tutoring information is updated regularly on the school website, under the "Parents" section. Important updates, including assessments and tutoring schedules, are posted for easy access. Math provides several days of extended learning opportunities. Tuesdays: Math tutoring with the Math Honor Society, Wednesdays: General tutoring in the Media Center by NHS, Thursdays: Targeted Algebra I EOC and Geometry tutoring in separate rooms, and Saturdays: Algebra 1 and Geometry
