1. Call to Order- Ms. Glass called meeting to order. Order was second by composition member.

 - a. Accountability Funds-
 - i. Current balance of \$5,710.03
 1. Request for \$3,200 for student incentives;
 2. \$1,850-elo camps

These fund requests are aligned with our school improvement plan. Our school improvement plan is to encourage our students to achieve their learning goals. We also want to build our teacher's capacity, and we aren't receiving extra funds to support students' abilities and discrepancies in their learning. So, to accommodate and support student needs, or to do things like host ELO camp we need accountability funds in order to support student activity and achievement.

a. Principal Report

Students completed Mid-year assessments for PM 2 and iReady. Data will be used to realign instruction and support as we approach and prepare scholars for PM 3. Promotion Criteria includes all core subjects, schedule parent conference for updates

I propose that Accountability funds are fully utilized by the end of the year. Accountability Funds will be allocated to the following areas:

We have \$7200 dollars from Title 1 which is not enough only provides 4 weeks of afterschool camps. An additional \$3200 from Accountability will allow ELO camps to run for 9 weeks, 2x a week. Accountability funds will be used to purchase ELO instructional materials and supplies, pay for teacher salaries (\$40 per hour) – school-based teachers, administrators and district staff conducting afterschool groups.

Allocate \$1750 to student incentives to motivate and incentivize students' achievement.

Allocate money to Teacher incentives/staff appreciation for recognize and celebrating teacher contributions and achievements.

Black History Events will take place all through out the month of February where students will research, learn and present on the great contributions of notable and historic African American figures and history.
