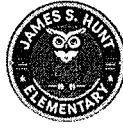

- I. Call to Order (Grant)
Meeting called to order at 5:15pm
- II. Introduction/ Attendance (Grant)
9 of the 20 voting members were present and in attendance. Quorum was not met. This was an information-only meeting.
- III. Approval of March Emergency Meeting Minutes- Approval of the Minutes from the previous meeting (Grant)

- V. SIP Monitoring & Stakeholder Feedback (Hart)
 - A. Area of Focus: School Data and Strategies
Ms. Hart noted that Hunt Elementary had recently concluded English Language Arts testing for PM3 for students in kindergarten and second grade. She also indicated that testing for students in the intermediate grades would commence in May. The school has been actively monitoring data and provided targeted intervention when needed through small group pullout and Extended Learning Opportunity camps. Ms. Hart also outlined how staff were participating in professional development opportunities designed to help them address student needs.
- VI. Principal's Report (Hart)
Ms. Har noted that the school was occupied with testing season and ensured that all students were given the support and guidance they needed to succeed on their PM3 assessment. Ms. Hart outlined the many incentives the school would offer students who attained proficiency or increased their scores between PM2 and PM3, such as a Carnival Day for Intermediate students. Beyond testing, the school intends to offer the graduating fifth grade students a series of activities, such as a Spirit Week, a Sneaker Ball, and a formal dinner

with pictures and live music. Ms. Hart also discussed efforts to plan for next year and how district wide budget deficits were impacting schools. James S. Hunt Elementary is in the process of submitting a proposal for a Twenty First Century afterschool grant program. The school was recently approved for a YMCA aftercare program that offers supper, homework help, art activities and field trips. Ms. Hart also informed the committee that Ms. Alhadeff from the School Board has allocated \$9400 for a golf cart to help improve school safety. James S. Hunt Elementary received \$250,000 from the school board to renovate the playground and is working to develop a new playground.

The Acaletics program that was approved from the previous meeting arrived recently. The school is currently planning the PM3 carnival and searching for a mascot costume.




XI. Adjournment
