Meeting called to Order:

- ❖ A meeting of the Westpine Middle School Advisory Council was held in the media center on December 5, 2025. The meeting was called to order by the SAC Chair, Geneveve Barnes, at 3:42 PM; seconded by Jennifer Roberts.

New Business:

Florida School Recognition A+ Funds

We met quorum. This meeting is for the voting process of A+ funds and how they are to be distributed amongst the staff. This meeting is being held to create a ballot for the voting process to divide the funds.

Mrs. Balog discussed the requirements that must be met in order to vote on how the monies are distributed. SRO, sub, nurse, SRPs are not eligible for A+ funds. She also discussed and showed what a sample ballot may look like.

Whatever the voting members of SAC recommends will be the final vote.

Staff members shared their proposal of how the funds should be split who could not attend the meeting.

Total funds available: \$56,274.46

Shelley Reid via proxy is proposing to put 25% percent towards the purchase of IXL for the 26/27 school year for all tested subjects.

We must be specific as to who gets the monies because this will include district support staff member and will total 110 persons. We can decide to give them a certain percentage if not at all.

Proposals recommended from those present:

McLemore brought up that only staff members who were here for the 24/25 school year should count.

Hall – can we address who gets what by name?

All of us minus district? Certain people based on what they contributed.

Valin – Recommendation to remove most of the district support, except for certain people. Ex. Dr. Edwards, Munoz, etc.

All staff getting an equal amount - If divided by 94 people (no district staff), everyone would get \$598.66

24/25 (106) and/or 25/26 (110)?????

Shelley - Reid – Can 25% go towards the purchase of the purchase student educational materials or IXL for the 26/27 school year. The rest is divided equally among the staff.

Guerrier - Put 15% towards academic help for students

McLemore – 24/25 – divided equally and ?% (district support) goes towards the small amount of individuals. This amount should not exceed what the majority is getting.

Mr. O – Anyone who worked over 90 days should be eligible.

Valin – We need to be flexible. Monies should be given to staff that made an impact. If you were here a min of 75 days and not on leave, you get an equal portion of the funds.

Hall –

91% (\$46,089.23) of the monies are divided equally among all staff members who have worked 60% or more of the 24/25 school year, not to include the district staff.

7% (\$3,545.33) is granted to non-recurring supplemental activities and/or materials.

2% (\$1,012.95) is divided equally between the following 24-25 staff members made in eligible by the initial criteria. (Hueber, Edwards, and Marks)

Luly – Hall's proposal minus the 8% for non-recurring supplemental resources

99% of the monies are divided equally among all staff members who have worked 60% or more of the 24/25 school year, not to include the district staff. 1% is divided equally between the following 24-25 staff members made ineligible by the initial criteria. (Hueber, Edwards, and Marks)

Balog – let's vote on whether to use a percentage of the funds for educational supplemental resources or ELO, etc.

Summary of ideas

Option 1 91% (\$46,089.23) of the monies are divided equally among all staff members who have worked 60% or more of the 24/25 school year, not to include the district staff.

7% (\$3,545.33) is granted to non-recurring supplemental activities and/or materials.

2% (\$1,012.95) is divided equally between the following 24-25 staff members made ineligible by the initial criteria. (Hueber, Edwards, and Marks)
