  - iii. Dr. Berman was named City of Plantation Teacher of the Month, reflecting her dedication, passion, and daily commitment to students. Mrs. Robin Case earned SAC Teacher of the Month recognition for her leadership and service to our school community.
  - iv. Girls' Soccer advanced to regional competition. Boys Soccer reached District competition. Both Girls and Boys Basketball advanced to District play. Our Wrestling team produced Regional Duals qualifiers, District Champions, and District Runners-Up. SPSHS proudly hosted the Chris Hixon Wrestling Tournament and the District Middle School Debate Tournament, welcoming schools from across Broward County.
  - v. The Theatre Department is preparing its spring musical, showcasing student creativity and collaboration. Our JROTC program represented South Plantation High School at National competitions, demonstrating leadership, discipline, and teamwork. DECA is celebrating its 40th anniversary, honoring a long-standing legacy of student leadership, career readiness, and achievement.
  - vi. Nearly 200 seniors have already applied to Broward College, with many more applying to universities, technical programs, and colleges across Florida and the nation. Students who submit a verified post-graduation plan receive incentives, reinforcing our commitment to ensuring every graduate leaves with a clear next step.

- vii. Students are supported in meeting Florida graduation requirements, including passing Algebra 1 EOC and ELA PM3 assessments. Extensive tutoring and academic supports are available to help students succeed.
  - viii. Attendance remains a priority, as daily instruction matters, even on early release days. We emphasize that missed school means missed learning opportunities that cannot be recreated.
  - ix. Appreciation is extended to our teachers, families, clerical staff, security team, facilities staff, and—most importantly—our students. Their collective commitment is what makes South Plantation High School a special and successful place.
  - x. It is an honor to serve this community and to help lead the exceptional students at South Plantation High School.
