2. Review Minutes: 4/23/25, motion to approve at 8:07 AM by Nicole Beaney, seconded by Mario Marcano
3. School Improvement Plan (SIP) Goal Update:
 - a. **Math-** Mr. Creary and Mrs. Baker: Students scored 70% proficiency overall. Our learning gains rose from 61% to 64%. The lowest 30% students decreased from 55% to 54%. We will develop a root cause analysis and put a plan in place to reach our goal.
 - b. **ELA/Reading-** Mrs. Geraci and Mrs. Kraut: Students increased overall proficiency from 63% to 70%. Our learning gains rose from 63% to 67%. Our lowest 30th percentile students decreased from 60% to 57%. To impact the achievement of this subgroup, we will focus on increasing our pullouts and providing support earlier in the year. This will be part of our action plan for the next school year.
