Meeting Minutes  
April 29, 2025

The Central Park School Advisory Forum (SAF) met on April 29, 2025.

Guests that attended: Doug Satran, Jael Ciappesoni, Monika Moorman, Shareeke Edmead-Nesi, Lisa Raska, Melissa Million, Madeline Piegari, Lori Turner, Alicia Keppel, Nicole Spence-Goon, April Allen, Gilia Martinez

Mr. Satran called the meeting to order at 8:34 AM

Mr. Satran determined that we had a quorum.

Mr. Ewart requested a motion to approve the minutes. Ms. Raska made the motion, and Mr. Satran seconded the motion.

Mr. Ewart shared the testing policy on smart glasses. Mr. Ewart said that a strict ban will be implemented to avoid testing material being shared. Mr. Ewart said that those who wear smart glasses will be invalidated and the students will not be given an opportunity to take the test again. Ms. Moorman asked how a teacher would know if the student is wearing smart glasses. Ms. Million said that there is a camera in the top corner of the glasses. Ms. Moorman asked what if the smart glasses are prescription glasses. Mr. Ewart said that parents must ensure that children use standard non-digital prescription glasses if they need them for the test.

Mr. Ewart said that chairs have been advised not to sign budgets until mandatory training from the district is completed. Mr. Ewart said that the budget is a legal commitment so signing without training exposed chairs to liability regarding resource allocations.

Ms. Ewart explained IB program relocations. Mr. Ewart said that High School IB will be relocated to Deerfield beach or Miramar High for grades 9<sup>th</sup>-11<sup>th</sup>. Mr. Ewart said seniors may finish out this school year at their respective schools. Mr. Ewart said middle school IB will be relocated to Deerfield Middle or New Renaissance. Mr. Ewart said the transition will start next year for all students. Mr. Ewart said that CPE Feeder Path will be relocated to the Central Area Hub and those grades will have contact with regional directors for counseling. Mr. Ewart clarified that the updates for these programs will be finalized for the 2026-2027 academic cycle.

Mr. Ewart said that due to a shortage of monitors, the bathrooms have been locked during instructional hours. Mr. Ewart said there have been reports of a supply deficit like missing hand soap, towels and sanitary disposal bins. Mr. Ewart said that it was encouraged to take privacy-compliant photos of issues to share with the facilities task force. Ms. Edmead-Nesi said that parents are not on campus to take photos so perhaps they could encourage their kids to advocate for themselves if there is an issue. Ms. Edmead-Nesi said that students

should be encouraged to go to administration if they have made multiple attempts to go to the bathroom and the doors are locked.

Mr. Ewart said that there have been concerns about the safety of AI for families. Mr. Ewart explained that AI predicts text based on data patterns but does not “think” for itself. Mr. Ewart said that as a privacy guard one should never share personally identifiable information with AI platforms. Mr. Ewart said to always verify AI-generated answers against primary ground-truth sources. Mr. Ewart said that advanced students face frustration as plagiarism detectors flag high-level academic writing as AI-Generated.

Mr. Ewart said that 2026 Education Legislation mandates that portraits of George Washington and Abraham Lincoln be displayed in every classroom. Mr. Ewart added that, per SB 182, cursive instruction will be mandatory for grades 3 through 5. Mr. Satran said that the science of this is that graphing and phoning connections are made by learning print. Mr. Ewart said that, according to SB 896, they will be strengthening firearms penalties and expanding the Guardian program.

Mr. Ewart said that the proposed state funding and budgeting allots \$9,130 per student allocation. Mr. Ewart added that the 29.5 billion statewide budget addresses recruitment and rising operation costs.

Mr. Ewart said that principals have been asked to reduce their full-time budget by 10-12 percent. Mr. Ewart said that this has put schools at risk of losing guidance counseling and/or specials teachers.











Mr. Ewart said that the next DAC General meeting is May 13<sup>th</sup> and CAAC Session is May 21<sup>st</sup>.
