



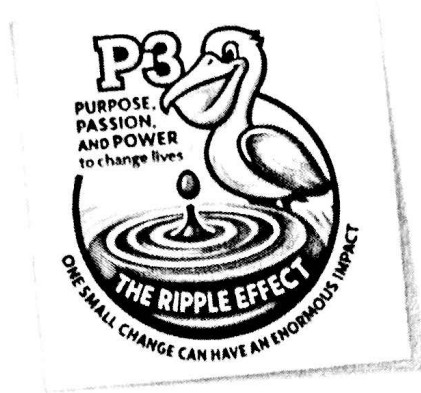

Call to order/Introductions/Attendance

Mrs. Fernandez made a motion calling for the meeting to order at 2:14 p.m. It was moved by Kerri Teramo and seconded by Lori McLaughlin. We had quorum with 12 out of 15 members present. Kimberly Carraha recorded minutes for this meeting.

Approval of Previous Minutes

- Approval of Minutes from February 2026.

Motion to approve the minutes was made by Lori McLaughlin and seconded by Mrs. Wagner.

Reports

• Chair's Report (Reading, Math, Science, and Writing)

- Ms. Koplo reported for science.
 - ELO camp has started and some students are going to additional STEAM support lessons during their specials.
 - Science Night is next week Wednesday, April 8 from 6:30-7:30
 - American heritage will be in attendance doing experiments in the cafeteria.
- Ms. McLaughlin reported for reading.
 - Most grade levels are on Unit 8.
 - Support pull out groups will be working on best practices for testing.
 - Students are encouraged to increase the number of lessons to increase their ability to pass those mid-level lessons.
- Mrs. Orrett reported for math and reviewed information from the district math meeting which included information on Data Analysis and Probability across grade levels which is being taught during this quarter.
 - Virtual math tools are available through Savvas, Didax and Math is Fun. Tools are also available on the promethean as well.
 - Examples of samples of data were shared (representation using tally charts, line plot, pictographs etc.), how to collect, interpret and analyze.

- Using cumulative data to drive instruction using performance matters reports
- Using flexible and fluid small groups
- The power point and detailed information is shared in teams.
- Writing presented by Ms. Benedit
 - Reviewed what each grade level was working on and felt that students are prepared for the mock writing tomorrow.
 - Shared what each grade level would be writing on (opinion piece, expository, letter etc...)

• **School Counseling Report -Ms. Fultz**

- Thanked presenters for coming to Career Day
- AI focus is on implementing co-pilot.
- Teachers are being taught how to utilize AI for their instruction,
- Students are being taught how to use it appropriately.
 - Jasmin Murias, parent, asked if there were any resources for parents on Ai. Ms. Fultz said she would follow up and find out.
- Testing Preparation tips can be found on the district website and on Ms. Fultz's canvas page
 - Focus on calm mornings, sleep and food. Call it "show what you know" not, "big test!"

 - ELO camps have started
 - Ms. McCray is on leave. Students that were receiving services from her are still receiving services from classroom assistants or specials teachers (tier 2) and classroom teachers are now providing students with tier 3 interventions.
 - PLE will be hosting summer school this year (to include students from neighboring schools) including ESE students and those in 3rd grade and at risk of being retained.
 - Summer camp will be taking place again this year
 - The new initiative for students not meeting their weekly i-Ready minutes, i-Ready Lunch, started with 32 students in 3-5th participating.
