### **Academics (FAST Assessments)**

*Second year in a row Broward County Schools District received an "A" rating from the Florida Department of Education. Key highlights included:*

- 96% of schools maintained or improved their grade*
- 110 schools earned an "A"*
- There were no "D" or "F" rated schools for the second consecutive year, first time since 1999*
- (8) Eight schools improved from a "C" to an "A"*
- 45 schools-maintained A's and Bs for five or more years*

### **FAST PERFORMANCE**

Overall Fast PM 1, PM 2, and PM 3 Trends in ELA and Math 2024 to 2026 (school year) all show upwards improvements

-South Region PM 1 ELA from 2024 -2026 School Years show improvements of 38, 40, and 45 of Level 3 and above

-Elementary Schools ELA PM1 in South Region from 2024-2026 School Years show improvement of 33, 35, and 38

-Middle Schools ELA PM 1 in South Region from 2024-2026 School Years show improvement of 41, 47, and 53

-South Region PM 1 MATH from 2024-2026 School Years show improvements of 19, 22, and 25 of Level 3 and above

### **Progress Monitoring**

-Interventions for students not performing at Level 3 (Collaborative Problem-Solving Team)

-Anything under 10<sup>th</sup> percentile triggers school officials to begin to look at the individual's student's deficiencies

-Parent gets support notification letter stating a plan to improve student scores (Notification is either printed out to parent or sent via FOCUS parent portal)

-In accordance with Florida Statute 1008.25 the initial parent notification must include: An explanation of the students' learning difficulty; list of current services that are being provided; and a detailed explanation of the proposed interventions and support that will be implemented (This plan must be developed within 45 days after results of PM 1 become available)

-Florida Statute also requires schools to evaluate all students scoring Level 1 or 2 on FAST, Algebra 1 or Geometry EOC to determine the nature of their academic difficulties and place them on one of the following plans: An IEP, a schoolwide system of progress monitoring, or an individualized progress monitoring plan (PMP)

-Reading Intervention Plans include:

Mastered Tier 2 (Ready to Graduate); Positive (Meeting or Exceeding Progress Expectations); Questionable (Making Progress but Not Yet Meeting Expectations); and Poor (Not Yet Making Progress)

### **AICE/IB/AP results at a glance**

- 71.3% of District AP Exam Pass Rate (5.56 increase from 2024)

- 71% of District AICE Exam Pass Rate (2% increase from 2024)

- 64.6% of District IB Exam Pass Rate (9.9% increase from 2024)

-Students allowed [7] seven courses and pass for AICE

-Students allowed [6] six courses and pass for AP

**\*Can take combination of both\***

-Flannigan High School has participation of 26 total; (9) nine for AICE; (17) seventeen for AP

### **School Choice:**

-First "School Choice" window opened on Monday, November 3 – December 19 and 2025; maybe extended (Options of up to 3 schools)

-Choices must be made using FOCUS parent portal

### **Middle/High School Block Scheduling**

Proposal of Superintendent for the 26/27 School Year is as follows:

-Seven Period Schedule

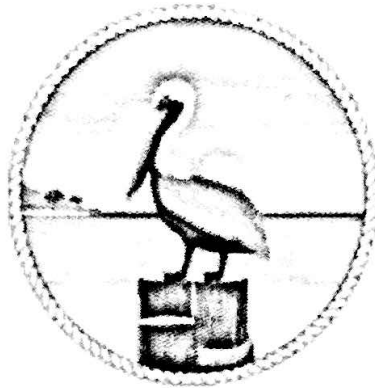
-Seven Period Rotation of one class less each day

-Modified A/B schedule

**\*Votes for block scheduling are narrowed to instructional staff only so far. Must meet and propose/finalize which one best fits school. If not finalized by December 12, 2025, school would automatically be placed into straight 7's block schedule. \***
