Call to Order

Mrs. Arencibia called the meeting to order at 8:04 a.m. A quorum was established.

Approval of Previous Minutes

A motion was made to approve the April SAC meeting minutes. The motion was approved by Mrs. Byers and seconded by another parent in attendance.

Principal's Report

Principal Collins welcomed members and thanked everyone for attending the May SAC meeting.

PM3 testing is nearing completion, and Davie Elementary expects to test 100% of eligible students, exceeding the state's required participation rate of 95%. Preliminary, unofficial results indicate that the school has met its School Improvement Plan goal of 54% proficiency.

As the school year comes to a close, students and staff are participating in several end-of-year activities and celebrations, including the Safari Ball, End-of-Year Awards Ceremonies, Multicultural Show, and FAST Celebrations.

Principal Collins reminded members that students would not be permitted to bring backpacks to school beginning May 29 through the remainder of the school year.

An End-of-Year Newsletter will be distributed to families highlighting student achievements, school accomplishments, and important information from the 2025–2026 school year.

School Improvement Plan (SIP) / Budget Presentation

Principal Collins presented information regarding the proposed 2026–2027 school budget.

Enrollment and Staffing

- Approximately 458 students are projected for the upcoming school year.

- Budget allocations are based on staffing positions rather than specific individuals.
- Personnel supplements and staffing allocations were reviewed.

Physical Education (P.E.) Discussion

- Due to budget considerations, the current P.E. position may be reduced to part-time status.
- Classroom teachers are required to provide daily physical education instruction.
- P.E. serves as a supplemental special area support.
- The school is required to offer Art and Music specials.
- Administration anticipates maintaining P.E. services; however, the exact specials schedule for the 2026–2027 school year has not yet been finalized.
- Scheduling models and compliance requirements were discussed, including how other schools structure P.E. instruction.

Stakeholder Discussion

Members expressed concerns regarding the potential reduction in P.E. services and discussed the positive impact physical education has on student engagement, wellness, and development. Administration shared that the specials schedule will continue to be reviewed and finalized during the summer months.

School Improvement Funds

Principal Collins reviewed available school improvement funds.

Accountability Funds

- Total Accountability Funds rollover: **\$33,807.78**
- Current available balance: approximately **\$16,802.66**

School Recognition Funds

- School Recognition Funds balance: **\$11,640.00**

Future Funding Requests

- The school anticipates requesting funding to support future student camp opportunities.
 - Title I funding approval for the ELO Camp was discussed.
