1. Call to Order: A meeting of the Pines Lakes Elementary School Advisory Council was held in person on Friday, January 30, 2026. Christina Dejean called the meeting to order at 7:37 a.m. Quorum was not established with 7 out of 14 members in attendance.

2. Minutes: Approval of November minutes. Dr. Jackson motioned to approve the November minutes. Ms. Balroop seconds the motion.

3. Reports

a. Principal Report: We have completed testing. Data is trending upward with increasing student achievement. Students enjoyed Inclusion Week and field day which occurred during the first week back from winter break. Thank you, PTA for the snacks provided to the students during field day. Literacy week and black history month will be in February.

b. Safety and Security: Fire drill and lockdown drill preparation and practice were completed upon returning from winter break. Our guidance counselor is available for support for students who experience anxiety due to practice drills.

c. School Improvement Plan Monitoring and Stakeholder Feedback:

- Proficiency goals in grades 3–5, ELA 55% or higher (58% for a school grade of an A), Math 60% or higher, Science 55% or higher.
 - Current ELA Data: 3rd grade – 39%, 4th grade – 52%, 5th grade – 46%
 - Current Math Data: 3rd grade – 35%, 4th grade – 30%, 5th grade – 32%
- RAISE Goal for Kindergarten – 2nd – schools must be 50% or higher in each grade level to avoid being on the state SIP.
 - Current Data: Kindergarten – 22%, 1st grade – 43%, 2nd - 36%
- Federal Percent of Points Index (FPPI) is above 41% for each subgroup. State SIP includes students with disabilities and Black African American.
 - Current Data: Students with disabilities – 38%, Black African American students – 35%

Science is not part of the SIP but contributes to our school grade. Current data shows 38% proficiency. This is not a full picture of expected proficiency as there is a second part. ELA ELO camp has started. Math will begin after ELA camp and continue until April. We have started a science word of the week. iReady scores have increased. The data has been analyzed with individual students and teachers. What I Need (WIN) groups have changed. Students have been moved from phonics to comprehension. Teachers receive support through PLCs. Some teachers have also attended SOAR

training and math training. We are receiving district support and ESOL strategy training. We offer math tutoring through Varsity Tutoring. Information regarding professional development for parents will be forthcoming. We are exceeding the number of referrals, which is attributed to two students. We are working with the district for assistance.

- d. School Accountability Funds:** Current balance is \$1,341.23. Items that can be purchased with the funds are instructional materials.
- e. School Environmental Safety Incident Reporting (SESIR):** No incidents reported August – September
- f. Title 1 Updates:** No updates

4. Unfinished Business

- a. Redefining Schools Update: It is expected 138 Palm Cove students will merge into Pines Lakes. All schools impacted are attending District meetings every other week. A district led meeting occurred at Palm Cove on January 29th, Pines Lakes and Lakeside principals were in attendance. Many of the questions were geared towards the ASD cluster.

6. New Business

- a. Parent and Family Engagement Survey results: We received 41 responses, exactly 10%. Received many positive responses regarding communication to parents and testing standards.

7. PTA Updates: There are currently 106 members. The Sweetheart Dance will be on February 12th, Book Fair is April 7th-10th. The Paw Store supports students' achievements for attendance and academic achievements.

8. SAF Updates: Food and nutrition balances will now be student obligations.
