Call meeting to order/ Attendance: A meeting of the Riverglades Elementary School Advisory Council was called to order by Stephanie Rodriguez at 9:38am. Secretary Kathleen Judd recorded the minutes. Attendance attached. The purpose of SAC is to provide you with information regarding our School Improvement Plan.

SAC Composition of Members: Rodriguez reported that we are bridging information from our school improvement plan to the parents and summarized the August minutes. Jo-Anne Seltzer made a motion to approve the August minutes. Michael Goldberg seconded. Motion outcome: Minutes from August, 2025, approved.

School Improvement Plan (SIP):

- a. School Information- School website was shared
- b. High Quality Instruction- Rodriguez went over our iReady weekly expectations. 40 minutes reading, 40 minutes math. 2 passed lessons in reading and 2 passed lessons in math. Total- 80 minutes and 4 lessons.
- c. Safe and Supportive Environment- Professional Learning Communities. These meetings occur during the school day- accountability funds are used towards substitute teachers for this. Teachers meet with their grade level, support staff, administrators, and many times with content area experts from the school district. Trainings are held during this time, data is discussed, meetings are student focused.
- d. Effective Communication- SAC dates (separate email sent out with meeting dates)

Accountability SAC Funds: \$9,399.62

School Environmental Safety Incident Report (SESIR): Duhart reported that there was an incident where a student struck an employee. Anytime there is assault against an employee, you must report it as SESIR.

Principal's Report- Seltzer discussed that when comparing PM1 scores from last year, we are now higher than we were this year. We will look at PM3 scores from last year to determine what is needed this year for learning gains. We have a school wide WIN (What I Need) block and now we are starting our WIG (Wildly Important Goal) for our leader and me notebooks. Example: "If my goal is to be a certain level on FAST by PM 3, how will I get there?" One way could be 2 passed lessons and at least 40 minutes in iReady in Reading per week.

Questions, concerns & ideas: It was asked how non- SESIR incidents like referrals are tracked? Duhart said we track and use the data for our school wide behavior plan. We will bring back data to the SAC next meeting. Another concern brought up was the amount of testing going on from K-5. We discussed that this year assessments (Benchmark Unit and Savvas topic and cumulative) were streamlined to Performance Matters and it is a change for us all, but it can assist with data and report being in the same platform.
