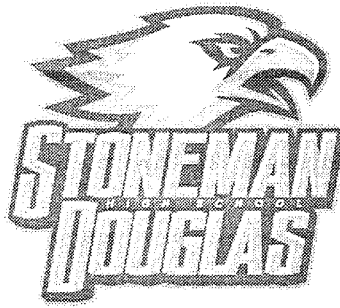

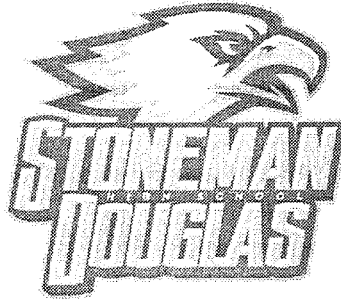

- a. SESIR, updates are based on prior SAC meeting, data solely reflects 25-26 school year, forthcoming data pending the State update
 - i. Alcohol = (+1)

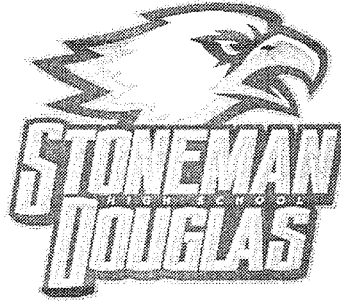

- IV.** Principal's Report- Kefford
 - a. SESIR- no updates from prior meeting, data reviewed
 - b. Senior exams continue this week for seniors; cap and gown distribution will be May 29th, during specific alphabetized time blocks; Graduation is June 1st at 3pm at Hard Rock; Mandate State Health Lessons are being taught through science classes; Exams for underclassmen run 5/29-62 as half days and 6/3 as an early release day; Testing Data reviewed and presented, overall proficiency across the board was impressive and compared, learning gains will be reported later, only initial data was reviewed- 3:22
 - c. 2026-2027 Budget Review- presentation of projection, final numbers are based on October FTE Survey; we expect to be over-enrolled based on projection and will receive more funds if we end up with more students than the district projects; Total Projected Allocation: \$10,973,234; expecting 28 less sections and 1 less

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teacher/instructional for next year, 2 SVE staff reduction, new VE program will add 10 sections, Instructional support will drop from 4 to 3.5; No changes to admin (1 Principal and 5 APs, we've been operating with 4 APs), clerical is losing 2 (previously 3) administrative assistant and 1 General Clerk (previously 4), losing 4 (previously 8) ESE Teacher Assistants, losing 1 (previously 2) job coach, losing 1 facilities serviceperson (previously 5); no new SAF funds are projected to be sent to the school; A+ funding is reviewed, will likely take place in November- 3:34
