I. MEETING DETAILS

1. SAC Chair Report:

The SAC Chair welcomed all stakeholders to the meeting and thanked them for coming out. Mrs. Haughton read the January minutes. It was approved by Mrs. Amos and seconded by Mr. Castrillon.

2. Administrator's report:

Mrs. Butler reported that i-Ready Diagnostic 2 was administered in January, and the results are now available. She noted that significant work is still needed to maintain our "A" status. We have already begun implementing Crunch Time, and it is imperative that students are present every day as we intensify instruction. Instruction at this time of the year is more prescriptive and strategic to meet the needs of all students. We need the support of our entire school community during these final months as we strive for an "A." Extended Day will continue from 2:00–3:00 p.m., and all students in grades 3–5 are eligible to attend.

She provided an update on the school's incentive programs, noting that the i-Ready incentive is progressing well. Students are highly motivated and enthusiastic about completing lessons in order to be recognized on a weekly basis. The class with most i-Ready lessons completed with a 70% or higher are also recognized each week. She also shared that the cafeteria incentive program is yielding positive results, with improved student behavior during lunch as classes strive to earn weekly recognition.

3. PTO Update:

Our Spring Dance is just around the corner, and students are eagerly looking forward to celebrating before Spring Break. The dance will take place on Thursday, March 12, 2026. Flyers will be sent home with students as the event gets closer.

NEW BUSINESS

Parent and Family Survey: A total of 67 parents completed the Title I Parent Survey, exceeding our goal of 40 parents (10% participation). Parents were given the opportunity to provide input on the survey. One key area for improvement, as suggested by parents, is increasing participation for the upcoming school year. To achieve this, we plan to make surveys more accessible by having them readily available at every school event.

School Improvement Plan: The School Improvement Plan (SIP) was reviewed and discussed with all stakeholders. Mrs. Amos presented the school's Reading, Math, and Science goals for the current school year and reviewed FAST PM2 data, highlighting gains in student proficiency from PM1 to PM2, as well as comparative growth between PM2 from the previous school year and PM2 of the current year. Stakeholders were provided the opportunity to review the current SIP goals, strategies, and progress, and were invited to share feedback, questions, and recommendations to support continuous improvement and inform the development of the 2026–2027 School Improvement Plan. However, stakeholders did not provide any feedback at the time.

Title 1 Event: This school year's events were well attended, reflecting strong family and community engagement. One key highlight was our Math Night Celebration. Social Media Analytics show that our school activities receive thousands of views per month, effectively spreading awareness and engagement. Parents were given the opportunity to provide input on the review and were excited to hear about these successes. One key suggestion was to increase outreach by advertising future events at the community park, which could help boost participation even further.

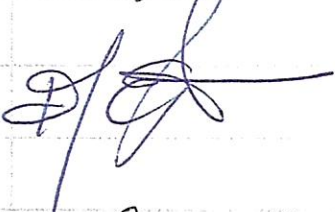
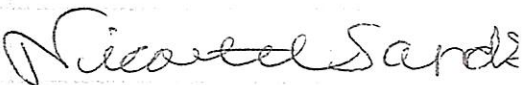

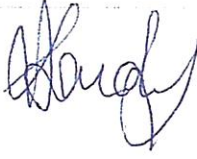
