- I. **WELCOME/SIGN IN** – The committee members were welcomed and thanked for their attendance. A motion to call the meeting to order was made by Mrs. Freeman and Mrs. Majzoub.
- II. **REVIEW/APPROVAL OF APRIL MINUTES** – The minutes were previously emailed to the committee for review. A motion to approve the minutes was made by Mrs. Iser and seconded by Mrs. Freeman, minutes approved.
- III. **PRINCIPAL UPDATE: Ms. deZayas**
 - a. **F.A.S.T PM3 UPDATES** – Excited for the FAST data in reading. The raw data reported our school at 87%, which is amazing. Last year our raw data was around 81%. Currently 3rd grade stand alone data shows 90% proficiency and the learning gains are spectacular. All of our students did really well, we were even pleasantly surprised by a few of the lower students. We will be having our FAST Math on next Tuesday and Science on May 20th. This year our ESE students have and will be tested in small groups by their homeroom teacher; we feel that this makes a positive impact with our students. Our afterschool academic camps have also made a difference as well as our Leader In Me program; helps students to be held accountable for their academics.
 - b. **After-School Tutoring Camp** – Camps ended just prior to testing with Science camp ongoing until just before testing.
- IV. **SCHOOL BUDGET: \$333.00** – We just had our budget meeting for the 2025/2026 school year. Unfortunately, we will be eliminating three teaching positions; this is based on our forecasted enrollment for the new school year. The three teachers are Mrs. Criado, Mrs. Capote & Mrs. Valencia. A few teachers have transfers in, if they get picked up by another school, we are hoping to bring them back. Early kindergarten registrations are important for this reason. We will be opening a second ASD class. In addition, one of our families would like to fund a Science lab, we are having conversations on what this could look like.

1. REVIEW / APPROVAL OF MAY MINUTES

The meeting was called to order at 2:23pm. The minutes of the previous meeting were emailed to the committee for review. A motion to accept the minutes was made by Hania and seconded by Monica minutes approved.

2. **VOTING CHAIR POSITIONS AVAILBLE** - Nominations were made for the available positions of SAC Chair, SAF Chair and i-Zone Representative. Mrs. Iser nominated Michele Laudanno for SAC Chair, the nomination was accepted. A vote was taken by a show of hands; there was unanimous consensus for Michele Laudanno for SAC Chair. 4. PRINCIPAL UPDATE - deZayas

a. B.O.Y testing (Beginning of Year)

Ms. de Zayas explained to the committee the importance of the SAC Committee and how the Committee sets the blueprint for the school including goals, budget and working towards meeting those goals.

Historical data was shared back to 2020. The data was reviewed; school grade ranking compared to the district ranking. We are doing phenomenally but there is always room for growth. We were #9 in the district in Math learning gains, this is the data that will drive our instructional plan, this is where we need to work on. How do we balance the learning gains scale? Well, we have implemented a specials schedule for 4th grade teachers, the teachers have team planning time to plan together.

Leading data was shared with PM1 - ELA & math - compared to last year's PM1, PM2 data will be shared before the holidays.

I-ready leading data was shared. I-ready is personalized and scaffolds the students based on their performance. Students are not only completing but also passing the modules. There will not be an i-ready diagnostic this year, they used last year's end of year data to personalize the pathways. Teachers are to either remediate or accelerate based on the students' needs.

b. **Science Lab** - We are excited to share that we have a brand-new science lab. A parent donor donated \$6k and our PTA matched the donation. Our 3d grade classes went thru the science lab today.

We also have a brand-new mural for the science lab hallway donated by Camp Wannado; thank you Camp Wannado for your support.
